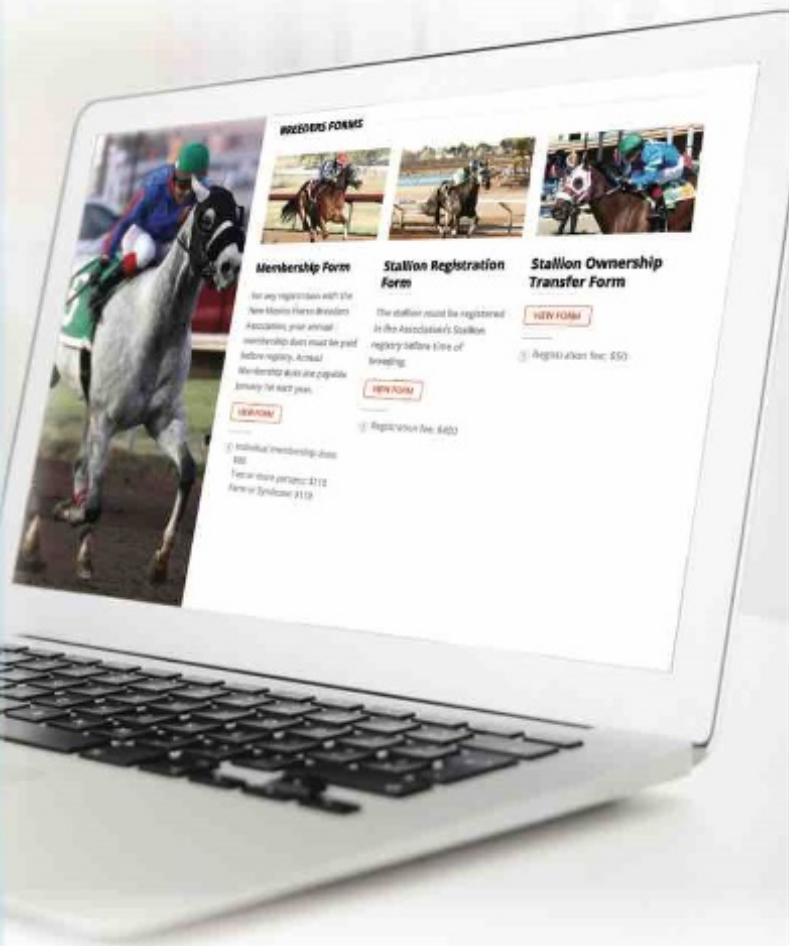

If you go to nmhorsebreeders.com and click on Breeders Forms, you'll find an arrow at the bottom of the page. Click it, and you'll be taken to applications.

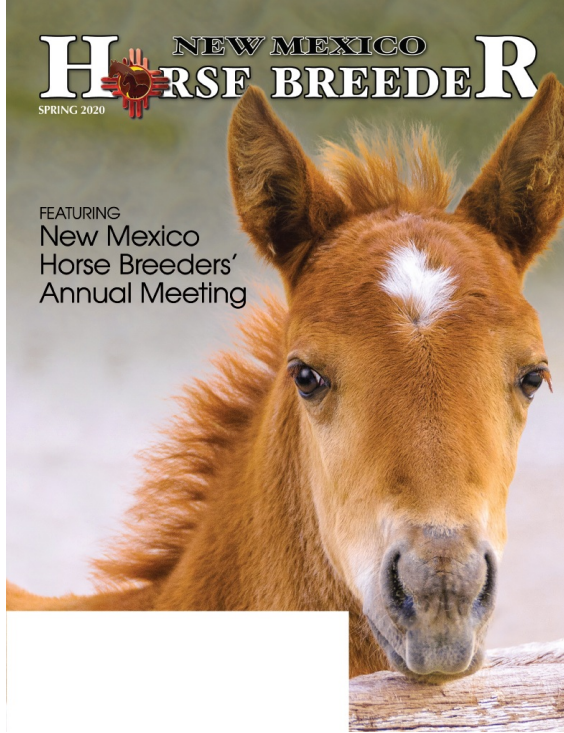

Racehorse Fitness Training

To perform at high levels, any horse – especially racehorses – need to be in top condition. The goal of any basic horse conditioning program is to enhance the psychological and physical responses to exercise.

Psychological responses include greater confidence and desire to perform, and minimized boredom and resentment. Physical responses include greater strength and endurance; enhanced skills, such as breaking from the gate quickly; and minimized soreness or injury due to exercise.

When a horse is in peak mental and physical condition, the trainer has the makings of a true athlete.

Read on to see the most important physical adaptations achieved by conditioning a horse, plus the two general classes of conditioning programs.

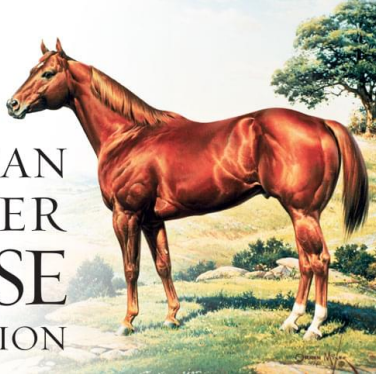
