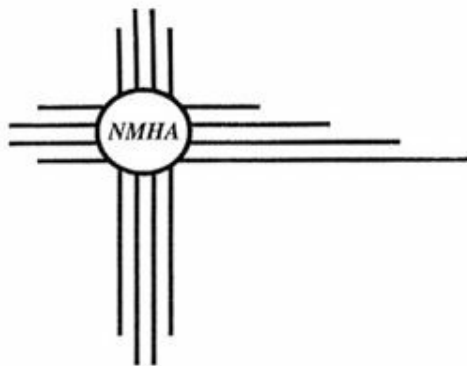

The NMHBA would like to offer our deepest condolences to the Stevens family. Funeral services for Latane "Latie" Baird Stevens, 87, of Lamesa were held today Friday, July 12, 2019 at 10:00 a.m. at First Baptist Church of Lamesa with Pastor Jim Medley officiating. Interment will follow in Dawson County Cemetery under the direction of Branon Funeral Home. A visitation was held Thursday, July 11, 2019 from 6:00-8:00 p.m. at Branon Funeral. Latie waited for her 67th wedding anniversary to celebrate and receive her dozen roses until she passed away Tuesday July 9, 2019 in Lamesa. She was born November 11, 1931 in Knox City to Velma (Adkins) and Wynn Baird. She married Sam Stevens July 9, 1952 in Clovis, New Mexico. They were married for 67 years. Latie began breeding thoroughbred race horses in 1973 and that quickly became her passion. That's Who and Tracy Dias were her favorite and most accomplished horses having won numerous stake races. She was a talented artist and loved painting, making ceramics, cooking, and baking. Latie always had a beautiful smile for everyone that she met. She is survived by her husband, Sam Stevens of Lamesa; children, Ricky McKnight and wife, Debi, Randy McKnight and wife, Alice, Sammy Stevens and wife, Trusilla all of Lamesa, and Terrie Snodgrass and husband, Brent of Lubbock; brother, Connie Gene Baird and wife, Dorothy of Midland; son-in-law, Mark Smith and wife, Cristina of San Antonio; 16 grandchildren; and 37 great-grandchildren. Latie is preceded in death by her daughter, Sherrie Smith; and her parents.

Please Note:

We are receiving many NM Bred Applications (Form 100 /

100A) that are incomplete or filled in incorrectly. In order for us to accept an application and register a horse, **ALL** fields must be filled out in their entirety. Leaving sections of the form blank or filling in with N/A is not acceptable answer. If you are unsure of any of the information, please find out. To avoid any delays in registering your horse please ensure everything is done correctly and all forms are completely filled out. Once we have a paid application on file your papers **MUST** be stamped by the office in order to be an accredited NM bred, TB foals of 18' on are now digitally stamped. Horses will not be assigned a number without information on the application and papers being verified for accuracy. The NM Bred applications have been attached further down the newsletter.

Please make sure ALL NM Bred papers are stamped prior to sending them to the Ruidoso Sale. If you do not see our NM Bred stamp either embossed on your QH papers or digitally stamped on the TB papers, please call the office and we can get it sorted out. Remember they are not a NM Bred until they have been stamped and assigned a registration number.



The NMHBA Trustees voted to amend the timeframe that an owner has to provide the Association with the forms for Broodmares in Foal to Leave the State of New Mexico. Beginning with the 2019 breeding season the form and the fee will be due on October 1 of the year bred. The form must be postmarked or received in our office by that date (October 1) or the \$2000 penalty will be assessed to make the resulting foal eligible to be a NM bred.

The Trustees also voted to eliminate the Broodmares in foal returning to the state of New Mexico form, as

our form to register a NM bred foal, details all locations the mares were kept prior to foaling. We will still be sending affidavits to the farms that receive the mares to foal out, and may visit farms to confirm

the mare and/or foal are on the premises. Failure to return the mare to foal in New Mexico will result in the foal NOT being registered as a New Mexico bred and that foal will NOT be eligible for the New Mexico bred program. NO refund of fees will be made.

These changes were made to allow the owners of the mares going out of state during their pregnancy, to have their mares confirmed in foal before the member pays the fees.

Your mare must still be registered with the association by September 1st of the breeding year.

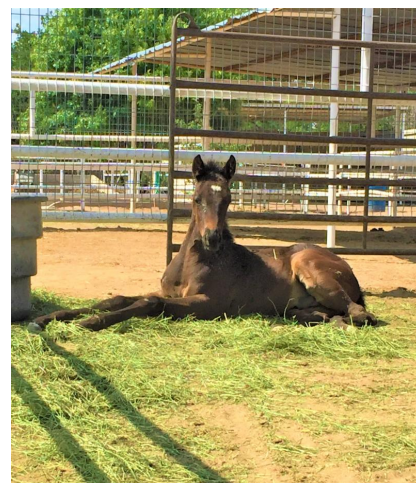
SEPTEMBER 1ST BROODMARE DEADLINE

If not already completed, all mares must be put into the NM Broodmare registry no later than September 1st, of the breeding year or penalties will apply on her foal.

There seems to be a lot of confusion on the broodmare registry. Please note that just because a filly or colt was an accredited NM Bred foal, this does **NOT** automatically make it a NM Broodmare or NM Stallion. These are separate registries. In order to register a NM Bred foal without penalty, the broodmare must have been registered with us no later than September 1st of the breeding year. Likewise the sire of a foal must be entered into the Stallion registry **BEFORE** breeding and must not go inactive in the subsequent years or penalties will apply. You may always call the office to check on the status of Stallions and Broodmares



Don't forget to submit your NM Bred Applications! Remember you can always fill out our application even before you register your foals with AQHA or The Jockey Club. All horses age Jan 1. then price increases.
