# **RACING NEWS**



# Cases of Vesicular Stomatitis have been confirmed in New Mexico. Please be vigilant.

(Albuquerque, New Mexico) – As fair season approaches, the New Mexico Livestock Board announced several recommendations as a result of confirmed Vesicular Stomatitis Virus (VSV) cases in New Mexico horses. New Mexico State Veterinarian Dr. Ralph Zimmerman urges people to be diligent.

"While we are not ordering the cancellation of any events at this point, we recommend several advisable steps to keep animals safe," said Zimmerman. "I encourage common sense

decision making and overall awareness of the situation."

Following is a list of recommendations for fair organizers, rodeo organizers and for individuals bringing animals to events:

- Either an Extension agent, local veterinarian or a knowledgeable livestock person should be present at entry gates to check animals' mouths for lesions (using fresh gloves for each animal)
- Questionable animals should be sent home before they enter the grounds
- The use of fly spray is encouraged
- Do not handle other people's animals
- Avoid sharing grooming equipment
- Use your own water buckets
- If an animal breaks with Vesicular Stomatitis on the grounds, send them home immediately

At this point, state officials are not requiring a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection for intrastate travel.

VSV cases have been confirmed in Valencia, Sandoval, Los Alamos and Santa Fe Counties thus far.

The virus can affect horses, cattle, sheep, goats, swine, camelids (alpacas and llamas) and cervids (deer species). Symptoms may include oral lesions, oral blistering and drooling, but please refer to the New Mexico Livestock Board website for more detailed

Please be sure to contact your veterinarian if you plan to travel from New Mexico to other states with horses or other livestock. This disease is reportable in New Mexico, meaning animal owners are required to notify USDA or the state veterinarian if your veterinarian suspects VSV. If you suspect Vesicular Stomatitis Virus, please contact the New Mexico State Veterinarian Dr. Ralph Zimmerman at 505-841-6161 or USDA-Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS)/USDA-Veterinary Services (VS) at 505-313-8050.

#### Zia Futurity Trials Recap



Mister Riptide (pictured), a son of Woodbridge owned by Mark and Annette McCloy, is the fastest qualifier to the July 28 Zia Futurity (RG1) for New Mexicobred 2-year-olds.

Ridden by Ricky Ramirez for trainer Trey Wood, Mister Riptide on Friday won the last of 11 400-yard trials by 2 3/4 lengths in :19.483. The sorrel gelding was winning for the second time in three outs and increasing his earnings to \$27,039.

Mister Riptide was bred by Mac and Janis Murray's MJ Farms at Veguita, New Mexico. The McCloys acquired the gelding for \$22,000 at last year's New Mexico-Bred Sale at Ruidoso Downs.

"It was getting toward the end of the sale, and we were looking for a filly," Mark McCloy said. "We saw him and bought him, even though he was a gelding." Mr Riptide's dam, Ms Riptide, is a winning and multiple graded stakes placed 12-year-old daughter of champion Ocean Runaway. His second dam, the Mr Jess Perry mare Sixes Ms Perry, won the 2004 AQHA Texas Distaff Challenge Stakes (G3) at Sam Houston Race Park.

Second-fastest qualifier Six Pack Fame won the sixth trial by 1 1/2 lengths in :19.614. Sergio Becerra Jr. rode Six Pack Fame for owner Diamond Racing Stables and trainer Jose Luis Muela.

"He was on the lead from the start," said Becerra. "He tried to go out a little, so I went to the right hand (with the crop), and he straightened out."

Six Pack Fame was bred by MJ Farms and was a \$26,000 purchase at last year's Ruidoso Select Yearling Sale. The gelded son of Jesse James Jr has won two of four races and has banked \$34,124. He was a finalist in the May 5, 300-yard New Mexican Spring Futurity (RG2) at Sunland Park.

This year's Zia Futurity will offer a stakes-record purse of \$433,129 purse. The complete list of qualifiers appears below:



#### Please Note:

We are receiving many NM Bred Applications (Form 100 / 100A) that are incomplete or filled out incorrectly. In order for us to accept an application and register a horse, **ALL** fields must be filled out in their entirety. Leaving sections of the form blank or filling in with N/A is not acceptable answer. If you are unsure of any of the information, please find out. To avoid any delays in registering your horse please ensure everything is done correctly and all forms are completely filled out. Once we have a paid application on file your papers MUST be stamped by the office in order to be an accredited NM bred, TB foals of 18' on are now digitally



stamped. Horses will not be assigned a number without information on the application and papers being verified for accuracy. The NM Bred applications have been attached further down the newsletter.

Please make sure ALL NM Bred papers are stamped prior to sending them to the Ruidoso Sale. If you do not see our NM Bred stamp either embossed on your QH papers or digitally stamped on the TB papers, please call the office and we can get it sorted out. Remember they are not a NM Bred until they have been stamped and assigned a registration number.

The NMHBA Trustees voted to amend the timeframe that an owner has to provide the Association with the forms for Broodmares in Foal to Leave the State of New Mexico. Beginning with the 2019 breeding season the form and the fee will be due on October 1 of the year bred. The form must be postmarked or received in our office by that date (October 1) or the \$2000 penalty will be assessed to make the resulting foal eligible to be a NM bred.

The Trustees also voted to eliminate the Broodmares in foal returning to the state of



breeding year.

New Mexico form, as our form to register a NM bred foal, details all locations the mares were kept prior to foaling. We will still be sending affidavits to the farms that receive the mares to foal out, and may visit farms to confirm the mare and/or foal are on the premises. Failure to return the mare to foal in New Mexico will result in the foal NOT being registered as a New Mexico bred and that foal will NOT be eligible for the New Mexico bred program. NO refund of fees will be made.

These changes were made to allow the owners of the mares going out of state during their pregnancy, to have their mares confirmed in foal before the member pays the fees. Your mare must still be registered with the association by September 1st of the

## **Additional forms & reminders**

SEPTEMBER 1ST
BROODMARE DEADLINE
If not already completed, all mares must be put into the NM
Broodmare registry no later than September 1st, of the breeding year or penalties will apply on her foal.

There seems to be a lot confusion on the broodm registry. Please note that because a filly or colt was accredited NM Bred foal does NOT automatically a NM Broodmare or NM Stallion. These are sepa

There seems to be a lot of confusion on the broodmare registry. Please note that just because a filly or colt was an accredited NM Bred foal, this does NOT automatically make it Stallion. These are separate registries. In order to register a NM Bred foal without penalty. the broodmare must have been registered with us no later than September 1st of the breeding year. Likewise the sire of a foal must be entered into the Stallion registry **BEFORE** breeding. If a stallion leaves the state of NM, he will be marked inactive and must be reactivated for a \$200 fee if he returns to New Mexico to breed. The stallion must be active and standing in New Mexico at the time of conception. You may always call the office to check on the status of Stallions and **Broodmares**
