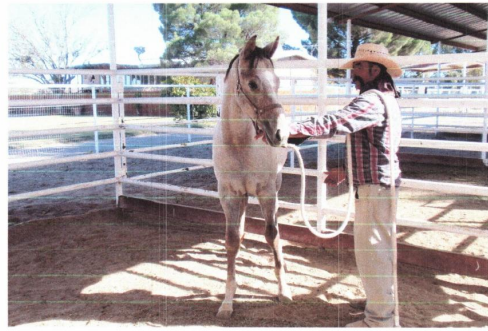

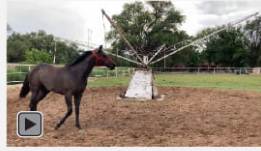

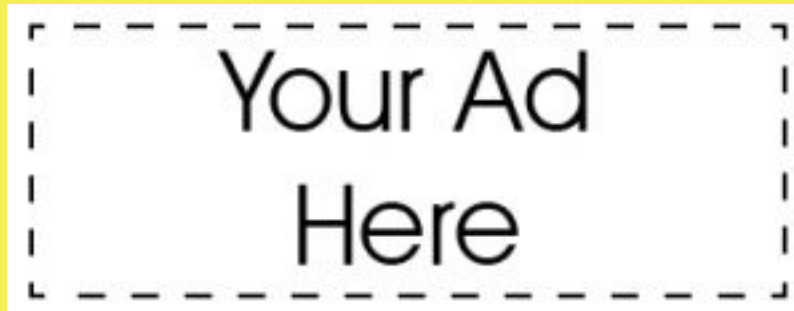

Galen Kieth Hill was born August 17, 1953 in Brush, CO, son of Kieth R Hill and Elsie E Hill. He passed away on July 24, 2020 with his wife of 42 years, Kathy, by his side. Galen was a hard-working country boy who grew up farming and ranching with his family in Eastern Colorado. He graduated from Liberty High School in



Joes, CO, in 1971, and moved to Greeley, CO. He worked a variety of jobs from pen checker, to heavy equipment operator, while farming his own place on the side with his wife. After a time, his entrepreneurial spirit kicked in and he bought a produce stand in Texas, sold that, and returned to Colorado to become owner of a paper recycling business which he grew to great success in 33 years. He sold that business in 2014 and redirected his time to full time farming. In all of these adventures, he strived to learn something new, try new things, and gained many friends in the process. It enriched his life.

Galen's love in life was faith, family, friends, and fast horses which were all intertwined. His faith led him to a desire to minister and help family and friends over the years. Ten New Mexico-bred stakes -- six for Thoroughbreds and four for Quarter Horses -- will be offered during the 27-day Albuquerque Downs meet, which opens Saturday.

Why Buy The Cow, a stakes-winning New Mexico-bred 5-year-old gelding trained by Simon Buechler for owner Carroll A. Durbin, is one of 10 middle-distance sprinters entered in Sunday's open 550-yard, \$20,000 Brigand Stakes at Ruidoso Downs. Why Buy The Cow won last year's New Mexico Cup 870 Championship (R) at Zia Park, and he will be making his first start at the 550 distance on Sunday.

The R.D. Hubbard Complete Thoroughbred Dispersal was a resounding success. With 54 offered in the Online Auction by ThoroughbredAuctions.Com, all 54 found new homes.

The auction grossed \$1,560,350 and averaged \$28,895. Median was \$17,500. The online auction had 246 registered bidders and 100,339 page-views at the close of the auction.

The high seller, bringing a final bid of \$91,250 was also the high selling race horse. Aisle Runner, a NM bred 2018 gelding, by Attila's Storm out of the Bernardini mare Garter, was already a winner, and qualified for the \$134,632 Rio Grande Senior Futurity , where he will race in the colors of the new owner, Ray Willis.

Second high seller and high selling stallion was leading New Mexico sire Attila's Storm. The 2002 stakes winning son of Forest Wildcat brought \$90,000 from buyer Jimmy Vasquez after staying in extended bidding for over 30 minutes. Attila's Storm is the sire of 22 stakes winners, and will remain in New Mexico, standing at Double LL Farms.

High selling broodmare was the multiple stakes producing daughter of Bernardini, Garter, who fetched a final bid of \$80,250 from buyer Victory Crossing, LLC. The 2008 mare is a half sibling to sires Stravinsky and Moscow Ballet (IRE). Garter sold pregnant to Attila's Storm.

High selling yearling was the 2019 filly by Attila's Storm out of the multiple stakes producing mare, Hang Glide. The NM bred filly, purchased by Doug May of Ft Stockton, Texas for \$62,250, is a half sister to six stakes horses and earners of over \$1,000,000.

High selling weanling was the 2020 filly by Attila's Storm out of Hang Glide. The filly realized a final price of \$55,250 from buyer B-4 Farms.

The R.D. Hubbard Complete Thoroughbred Dispersal had originally been scheduled during the Ruidoso Sale in August. After Ruidoso opted to move the live auction to the Lazy E Ranch in NM, ThoroughbredAuctions.com partner, Tim Jennings was contacted by R.D. Hubbard's grandson, Shaun Hubbard. From the first phone call, to the close of the auction, was a mere 22 days.

"We are grateful to Shaun Hubbard for having a vision, and trusting us to sell the fruits of his grandfather's legacy" said Tim Jennings. "We are also fortunate to have a proven platform where people in the Thoroughbred business have a place to market their horses from the safety of their homes. "

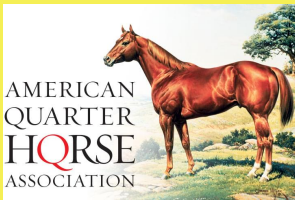
