New Mexico Horse Racing Industry Digitize the Parimutuel Domain with Advance Deposit Wagering

What is the Issue?

- The horse racing industry contributed \$828 million to New Mexico's economic output while supporting 12,973 jobs¹ at 5 tracks around the state.
- Horse racing is a key driver of the agricultural economy, tourism, and entertainment.
- In the 21st century the NM horse racing industry is STILL barred from using the Internet or mobile technologies to conduct ecommerce, thereby decreasing its potential impact.
- Since 2000, out-of-state digital operators have poached an estimated \$250 million dollars in wagers from NM residents while not returning taxes or revenues to the state or the racing industry due to no NM law prohibiting or enabling it.
- The COVID pandemic limited or shuttered tracks and prevented on site wagering driving even more customers to other sources.

What is the Solution?

- Advance Deposit Wagering (ADW) is the practice of wagering on live horse races using an online customer account, a licensed racetrack operator, and modern telecommunications.
- The ADW channel of wagering represents 35% (\$3.85 billion) of all North American wagering on horse racing and is the most transparent and safe wagering channel .
- The NM Racing Commission with HB 199 can license and regulate the tracks and their contracted ADW service providers who will operate under "know your customer" (KYC) policies and procedures and undergo SSAE Type II Audit standards.

What does HB 199 do?

- Enables only licensed racetracks to offer eligible customers a digital account into which they will deposit cash funds and wager on horse racing from the fund balance using their phones or an Internet portal. Bets will debit and winnings will credit the account.
- ADW Wagers will be taxed like on track wagers with statutory revenues to the state, to the purse account, to the Equine Testing Fund, and NM horse breeders incentive fund.
- NMRC will promulgate rules and regulate the activity in connection with track licenses.
- Does not violate tribal compacts as it is only wagering on live/simulcast horse racing.

Export Broodmare Return Forms

Foaling season is upon us! Those that participated in the export broodmare program and took mares home out of state need to remember to submit their return forms as they start bringing their pregnant mares back to New Mexico to Foal. Fees do apply if a form is not on file prior to foaling.

Remember, you can **start** the NMHBA registration process the day your foal is born! You **DO NOT** need to wait until you receive the QH or TB certificates. But remember the horse is not an official New Mexico Bred until the certificates have been finalized.



Racing News

Two registered NM-bred Quarter Horses -- Meleros Dash and Perrys Regard -- are entered in Friday's 350-yard, \$12,500 Allred Brothers Stakes at Turf Paradise in Phoenix. Meleros Dash is a 4-year-old son of the Time Bandit (TB) stallion Next Bandit (TB) owned and trained by Ivan Tafoya, while Perrys Regard is a 4-year-old Chicks Regard gelding trained by Casey Lambert for owner South Texas Longhorn LLC. Perrys Regard was a finalist in last year's \$248,000 New Mexico Cup Derby (RG2) at Zia Park.

We're all hopeful live racing racing will return to our state in the near future. Meanwhile, FOUR New Mexico-based trainers -- Justin Evans, Dick Cappelucci, Chip Woolley and Casey Lambert -- rank in the top 10 in the trainer standings at Turf Paradise in Phoenix (through Sunday, February 1). In fact, Justin tops all Thoroughbred trainers at the track with 22 wins from 63 starters for a win percentage of 35, and his starters have earned \$250,500 in purse money.

While live racing is on temporary hold in our state, New Mexico-bred Thoroughbreds and Quarter Horses have been making news at tracks throughout the southwest - and so have our horsemen. For example, Todd Fincher, a perennial leading trainer on the New Mexico circuit, has enjoyed success thus far at Sam Houston Race Park. Through January 30, Todd has won with five of his 16 starters for a win percentage of 31, and his starters have collected \$94,681 in purse earnings.
