All foals **MUST BE** conceived and born in NM to be eligible for NM Bred status. If a registered NM Broodmare in foal to a registered NM Stallion leaves the state of New Mexico:

- The application and the \$500 fee must be postmarked no later than the deadline of October 1st of the breeding year. If the application and \$500 fee are NOT received by the applicable deadline, there is a ten-day grace period and then the fee increases to \$1,000 for the foal to be eligible for NM Bred status.
- Every donor mare and every recipient mare that is taken to board out of state must have their own form filled out and you must pay \$500.00 for each or the larger \$1,000 penalty if the October 1 deadline is missed.

EXCEPTION (Bylaw change January 25, 2024):

- 1. All assisted reproduction techniques including but not limited to the transfer of embryos or oocytes must be performed within the State of New Mexico unless the service is not readily available in the state. OOCYTES may be done in other states if the out-of-state ICSI requirements are followed. The mare would be required to be enrolled in the Export Broodmare Program by October 1st of the year she was taken out of New Mexico.

"Fred and Linda Alexander's A & A Ranch stands some of the state's top sires at the Anthony, N.M., farm, including 2023 New Mexico leading stallion [Marking](#) as well as the state's 2023 leading first-crop sire [Sporting Chance](#).

"We've been here 25 years and we're proud to achieve this," Fred Alexander said. "It's been a lot of hard work but I owe most of it to my staff and my clients that have been with us over the years. We've been fortunate enough to have five of the state's leading stallions over the last 20 years."

Besides standing their three stallions, the Alexanders' operation focuses primarily on breeding and selling their yearlings through their own consignment each year at the Ruidoso Select New Mexico-Bred Yearling Sale.

A & A Ranch was the leading consignor the past two years at the New Mexico-Bred Yearling Sale and was responsible for the 2022 and 2023 sales toppers. In both years, the sale topper sold for six figures, a significant accomplishment in the Land of Enchantment.

Marking, a grade 1-placed son of Bernardini, won New Mexico's leading sires race by a landslide. The stallion boasted progeny earnings of \$2,580,008 for 2023." –

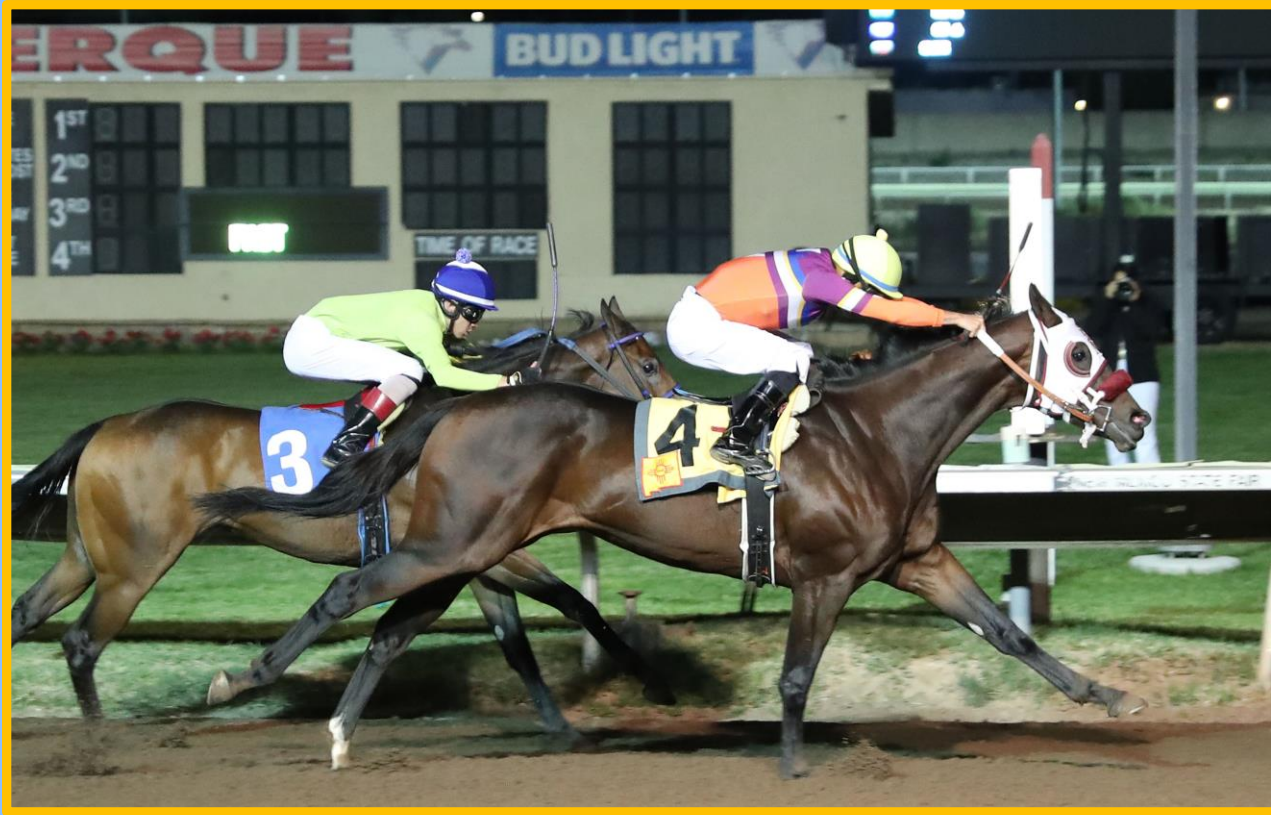

CARLOS SALAZAR

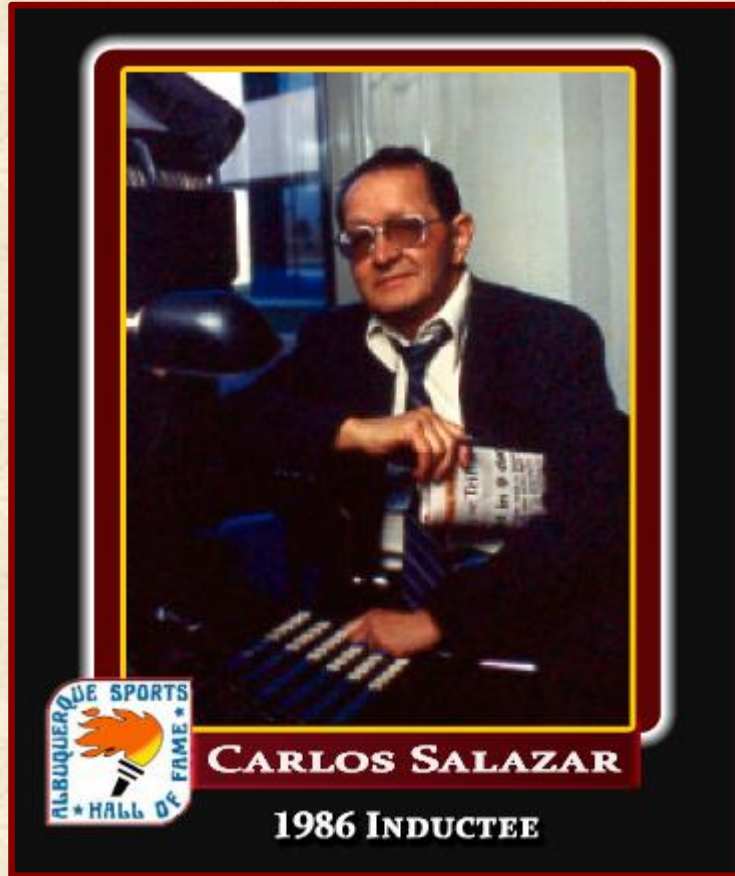

“Jon Carlos Salazar was a name that resonated with Albuquerque’s baseball scene for decades. He was also New Mexico’s most respected horse racing reporter, covering over 51 years of horse races.

Born in 1925 in Las Vegas, New Mexico, he left an indelible mark on the sport and its coverage. Here are a few highlights from his baseball journey:

Albuquerque Tribune and Dukes Coverage:

From 1946 to 1996, Salazar worked as a writer for the Albuquerque Tribune. His passion? Covering the Albuquerque Dukes, the city’s beloved baseball team.

For 27 seasons, he chronicled the triumphs, the heartaches, and the unforgettable moments on the diamond. His words brought the game to life for fans across the region.

First Writer in the Albuquerque Sports Hall of Fame:

New Mexico Horse Breeder May 1986

Sort'a natural

**COWBOY, RODEO HAND, SHOWMAN, JUDGE, TRAINER.
WHEN IT COMES TO HORSES, CASEY DARNELL HAS DONE IT ALL.**

When it comes to horse racing in New Mexico, not much can be said without the name "Darnell" turning up. Casey Darnell's influence on horse racing is like a supportive web reaching throughout New Mexico and beyond.

However, Darnell didn't start with race horses. Perhaps the name of his hometown had something to do with it, but Darnell says that the horse business "just came sort'a natural" to him. Darnell was born and raised in Rodeo, New Mexico where he ranched as a young boy. "After that," says Darnell, "I graduated to rodeoing. I went through the whole gamut of it. I roped, bull-dogged, team-roped, everything."

Darnell says that the only time he ever really took time out from horses was when he was in the service for three years. "Then I started showing horses. I raised them, showed them and judged at the shows," says Darnell.

Darnell's wisdom was recognized as he has served as president of the New Mexico Quarter Horse Association, president of the New Mexico Palamino Association, and is presently both on the board and honorary vice president of the American Quarter Horse Association.

Darnell says he got his real start with race horses after an impressionable trip to Lexington, Kentucky. "Those Thorough-

bred were really something," reminisces Darnell. "I came back home to New Mexico and bought my first Thoroughbred mare in Clovis; that was back in '63. Her name was Blue Sud."

That mare was enough to whet Darnell's appetite when he hitched up his little two-horse trailer and headed back to the land of the Thoroughbreds: Kentucky. It was there that Darnell bought a mare and a stallion — a pretty gutsy move considering the two-horse trailer he had to haul them back in, unless, of course, you're Casey Darnell.

"Those hard boots didn't think we could do it. We loaded that mare and

stallion together in Lexington and hauled them clear to Corrales, New Mexico," said Darnell.

Darnell says that he raced the mare, Trudeau, and she turned out to be a really good broodmare. "Out of her came Plucky Martha, Plucky May and Plucky April. Plucky April was the best runner out of the bunch and possibly the best broodmare," recalls Darnell.

Presently, Darnell's stallions are Wild Jose and Prince Yukon. He prizes Ghetto Blaster as his best runner — a horse well bred. "He is out of Turn Wild and by Plucky Blade. He's a full-brother to Wild Blade and Turn To The Orient and a half-brother to Wild Jose," says Darnell.

Darnell says that there is no sure way to tell if a colt is going to be an exceptional runner until you get them on the track. "You can tell, though, if they look good. And if they're bred good and look good, they probably will run to their potential. But you just can't tell if you're gonna' get one of those superstars like Secretariat. It's almost like a freak of nature when a horse can run that fast," explained Darnell.

Darnell says he breaks his colts at home, riding them along the peaceful ditch banks, where putting a sensible head on them is the all important fac-

tor. "Before going to the track, the main thing to do is to get them broke where you've got control and have them thinking about what you want them to do," says Darnell.

To do this, you work the colt as long as it takes. "The amount of time depends on the horse. Don't take a horse to the track unless he's ready or you'll get into trouble," warns Darnell.

Once at the track, Darnell says he works the horses through the gate, never really breaking them out of it fast until he is sure they are legged-up enough. "They can really hurt themselves if they are not ready for that strain," says Darnell.

Darnell is known to be generous with this wisdom and has a reputation for helping people break into the race business. One of New Mexico's better jockeys, Flavio Martinez, came to Darnell as a teenager. Martinez began cleaning stalls for him, then learning to gallop. Eventually, Martinez went on to become a top racer. Another example of Darnell's willingness to help newcomers is a now-competent horseman, Eloy Duree, who came to Darnell years ago with scarce knowledge of which direction you faced on a horse. Now, Duree gallops many of Darnell's horses.

"Eloy came to

me as green as grass," kidded Darnell. "The thing with Eloy was that the poor kid didn't have any balance. If a colt would get to going one direction, throwing Eloy a bit off balance, he would just plain plop over onto the ground . . . but he can sure sit 'em now!"

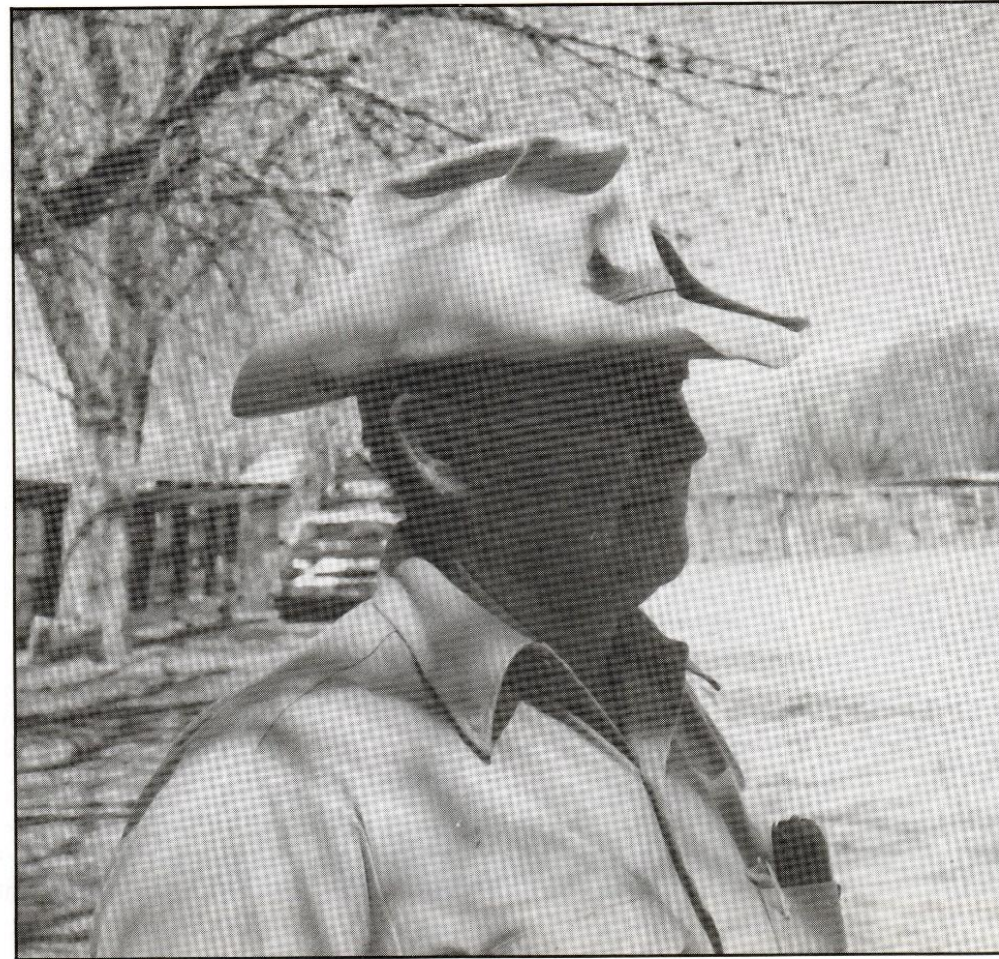
Darnell has six more people working for him besides Duree. However, Darnell says his most valuable worker isn't on the payroll...that worker being his wife. "Blair helps the most. She takes care of everything when we're not here. If something comes up that needs tending and no one is around, Blair will do it herself. She always has," explained Darnell.

Mrs. Darnell says that her job specs were simple, "To be here when they need me!"

Presently, Darnell says he is racing at The Downs at Albuquerque. "This new meet is the greatest thing to happen to New Mexico. It's great for everybody because it brings money to the state, increases jobs and contributes to the city's economy," says Darnell.

Before the Albuquerque meet, he had to haul to Turf Paradise in Phoenix, Arizona, for the winter. "Any time you have to move, it's very expensive. Hauling those horses costs roughly 50 cents a mile per horse. I get to stay home now, and I like that," says Darnell.

Moreover, the track condition is good

and closing in the grandstands was a real improvement besides the healthy purses. "On the bottom, the purses are \$2,950. That makes for about \$1,800 for the win. Then, if you get up to the top, allowance-type, well you'll be getting around \$5,000 which isn't bad. I've run a lot of stake races for a \$5,000 pot-total," explained Darnell.

Darnell says he tries to run all his horses as New Mexico bred. "I think the New Mexico Breeder Award Program is very important. The mare owner, stallion owner and horse owner all get incentive money if the horse wins. And it will get better," says Darnell, who has been the New Mexico Horse Breeders Association's president twice and is currently a board member.

"The breeder program allows racing to help the state's economy," says Darnell. He says that the breeders started back in the late 1960s and were able to get about a 10 percent commitment from the legislature. They didn't give up, though, and were finally able to convince them of the program.

"Now the quality of race horses in New Mexico has greatly improved," explained Darnell. "We have good studs in New Mexico because of the program and our New Mexico bred can now compete with the best of them, anywhere."

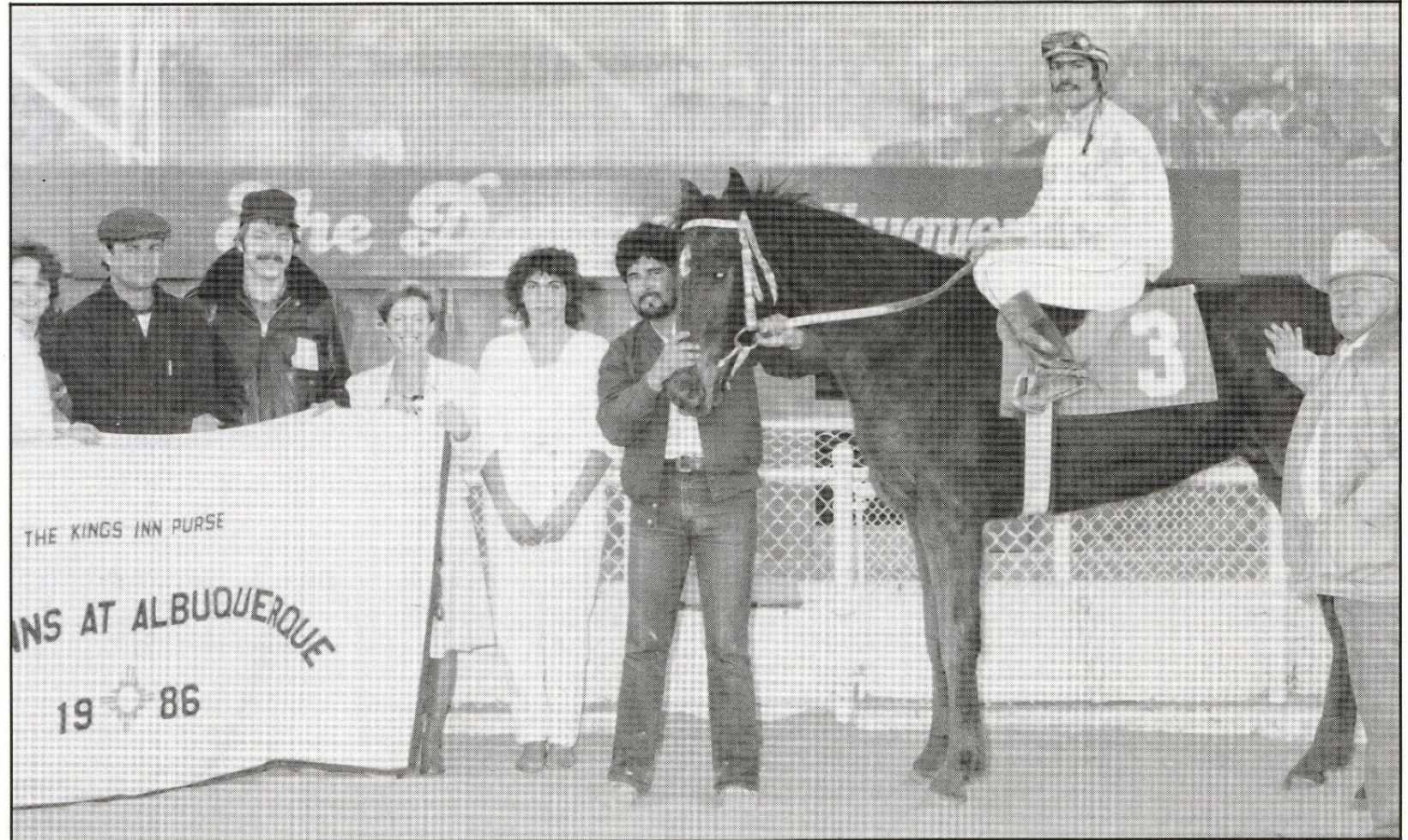

AQHA papers must be stamped in our office. Jockey Club papers are "stamped" online.

OWNERS

Due to a NM State statute, all owners running a New Mexico Bred on the track must become a 2024 member of NMHBA within 90 days of placing 1st, 2nd, or 3rd if not a 2024 member already!!

All memberships expire December 31 each year.

If you do not comply you will forfeit your 2024 Award Distribution checks in November!!

All foals **MUST BE** conceived and born in NM to be eligible for NM Bred status. If a registered NM Broodmare in foal to a registered NM Stallion leaves the state of New Mexico:

- The application and the \$500 fee must be postmarked no later than the deadline of October 1st of the breeding year. If the application and \$500 fee are NOT received by the applicable deadline, there is a ten day grace period and then the fee increases to \$1,000 for the foal to be eligible for NM Bred status.
- Every donor mare and every recipient mare that is taken to board out of state must have their own form filled out and you must pay \$500.00 for each or the larger \$1,000 penalty if the October 1 deadline is missed.

EXCEPTION (Bylaw change January 25, 2024):

- 1. All assisted reproduction techniques including but not limited to the transfer of embryos or oocytes must be performed within the State of New Mexico unless the service is not readily available in the state. OOCYTES may be done in other states if the out-of-state ICSI requirements are followed. The mare would be required to be enrolled in the Export Broodmare Program by October 1st of the year she was taken out of New Mexico.

STALLION EVA REQUIREMENTS

EVA REQUIREMENTS FOR NEW STALLIONS

All stallions **MUST** have a negative EVA test and be vaccinated for EVA within 10 days of the COLLECTION date according to the rules of the New Mexico Livestock Board before you can register them in the NM Permanent Stallion Registry.

EVA REQUIREMENTS FOR STALLIONS IN OUR REGISTRY

All NM registered stallions must have an annual EVA booster vaccination.

Per NM Livestock Board regulations, they must be quarantined for 28 days after receiving the booster because it is a live virus and can be passed to other horses.

The deadline to turn in the EVA Booster Certificate to our office is February 1, 2025.
