NMSF QH FUTURITY RG2 2 year olds 400 yards \$1.2 Million Est. Sunday, October 13

"Harken (pictured), a graded stakes winning son of Eye Am King and the fastest qualifier, drew post 7 for Sunday's 400-yard, \$1,160,420 New Mexico State Fair Futurity (RG2) for state-bred 2-year-old Quarter Horses at Albuquerque Downs.

A \$145,000 yearling purchase at last year's New Mexico-Bred Sale at Ruidoso Downs, Harken races for Alepony LLC. The sorrel gelding has earned \$237,214 from six races — all in New Mexico — and his four wins include a nose victory in the 350-yard, \$351,000 Mountain Top Futurity (RG2) at Ruidoso Downs on June 16.

Harken won the 11th of 14 New Mexico State Fair Futurity trials on September 20. Sergio Becerra Jr. will ride Harken for trainer Marco Flores..."





NMSF QH DERBY RG3 3 year olds 400 yards \$500,000 Est. Sunday, October 13

"Miss Hi Tide (pictured), a stakes-winning and Grade 1-placed daughter of the Dash Ta Fame stallion Woodbridge campaigned by Uno Menos, is one of 10 state-bred 3-year-olds entered in Sunday's 400-yard, \$442,075 New Mexico State Fair Derby (RG3) at Albuquerque Downs.

Miss Hi Tide is the fifth-fastest qualifier from her 1 3/4-length victory in the second of five trials on September 21. The sorrel filly has earned \$201,506 from five races in New Mexico this year, and her two wins include a one-length score in the 350-yard, \$175,000 Mountain Top Derby (R) at Ruidoso Downs on June 15. Miss Hi Tide's season record also includes a second-place finish, a half of a length behind winner Especially Goodcandy, in the 440-yard, \$662,000 All American Oaks (G1) on September 2..."



DO YOU REMEMBER... JAKE McSPADDEN & BABY K

Jake McSpadden and Baby K....

ake McSpadden settled back in his easy chair, rubbed the slight bristle of his beard, and looked out over the canyon where the popcorn snow peppering Ruidoso had just begun to change into wet sticky flakes.

"Some people may say we didn't have good horses back then," he mused, "but we did. What we didn't have were the good racing strips present today."

What prompted this retort was a question which had been put to him about comparing horses like Baby K, Wonder Lad, Pretty Boy, Miss Wichita, Joe Mac, Princess Campbell, Miss Bank, Miss Pinkey, Vinageron, Double Red and others (subjects of an earlier conversation) to current runners.


"Just take the time Baby K, my horse, won the Second Annual Futurity back in '47 at Hollywood Park (the original name of Ruidoso Downs). Man, at that time, the track had about a 17-foot upgrade to run in the 440 and the track wasn't worked between every race as it is today; in fact, if it got worked once a week things were good.

"So, Baby K runs it in :23.6," said McSpadden. "How in the world can you compare? And say," he expounded, "although this particular race was billed as the Second Annual Futurity, I have found no one who remembers the 'First'. So, I believe Baby K was the winner of the first futurity run at what is now known as Ruidoso Downs.

"There were 16 nominees who ran trials for that futurity," gushed McSpadden, who verbalizes information about horses in a steady gale tempo with occasional gusts up to hurricane velocity. "We ran it in four heats, four horses in each. We came back the following week to take the finals handily, with Joe Mac, Princess Campbell and Tee Joe following to the wire."


Although the embryo of the astronomically-rich All American Futurity might have been in the formative stages back then, Baby K's win at old Hollywood Park could have been a fertile seed.

"Good gosh, how racing has grown in New Mexico!" voiced McSpadden. "What does it cost to get a horse to the All American trials? Well, I can tell you it cost me \$100 to nominate and \$50 to run. Of course, the gross pot was only \$2500 and the winner's share was \$1900. But, man, that was nothing to sneeze at in those days!"

What happened to Baby K? "Oh, I ran her a few more times . . . even beat the Thoroughbred General Patton at Junction for \$5,000. I bred her but didn't get any good colts and finally woundup trading her back to Jim Derrick for a car." McSpadden had bought Baby K from Derrick as a yearling for \$200.

"I will say this," McSpadden added, "Baby K beat some good horses including Mamour. Derrick bought Mamou for \$2200 in Louisiana and later sold her to Dale Robertson for a bunch of money."

DO YOU REMEMBER ...

McSpadden was born and reared on a ranch near Alpine, Texas, and "grew up with horses." He purchased his first one, 'Blondie', when he was 19 years old. "She was a 7/8 Thoroughbred out of Jack Atkins and I ran her from 300 up to a half mile. It was mostly match races back then and I guess my first big win was when Blondie outran Dream Light, the Thoroughbred out of Kentucky."

The veteran horseman got into New Mexico racing after he moved to Artesia where he had bought a ranch. One of his early runners was Hickory Bill who he bought in partnership with Gene Benson. Another topnotcher was Wonder Lad.

"Wonder Lad was just an old feather-legged horse who liked to run. He held the half mile record at the State Fair for a long time," said McSpadden.

Although McSpadden didn't own her, his eyes lit up when he mentioned Miss Bank. "Finest horse I ever trained," he said.

"Miss Bank outran every horse that ever outran her, except Miss Princess, and that race was in the mud," he added. "She didn't have a fault at 12. We bred her to Worry Man and got Bankette and, of course, you know Bankette is the dam of Rebel Cause, which gets into some pretty high-powered blood."

Although McSpadden hasn't been in the racing business for several years, he had a dreamy look in his eyes when he spoke of his dispersal. "I had 13 proven race mares, including Flying Bob and My Texas Dandy breeding. At that time you could breed to Three Bars in Oklahoma for \$300. But I decided to get out of the business although I didn't give up the love for racing. Since I have moved to Ruidoso I go to the track every day. There is something about good running horses that just stirs a man up."

... and it has been men like Jack McSpadden who have stirred racing up. He ran horses down the roads and in the back country and hauled hundreds of miles to "match" when word got out about a good runner.

He can truly be classed as a pioneer in New Mexico horse racing!



REGISTER NOW!

You don't have to wait for your AQHA or Jockey Club papers to submit a New Mexico Bred application for your foals!
All foals MUST BE conceived and born in NM to be eligible for NM Bred status.

Remember the horse is NOT an official New Mexico Bred & CANNOT run in a NM Bred race until the certificates have been finalized by our office.

AQHA papers must be stamped in our office. Jockey Club papers are "stamped" online.

OWNERS

Due to a NM State statute, all owners running a New Mexico Bred on the track must become a 2024 member of NMHBA within 90 days of placing 1st, 2nd, or 3rd if not a 2024 member already!!

All memberships expire December 31 each year.

If you do not comply you will forfeit your 2024 Award Distribution checks in November!!

Out of State Embryo Transfer Questionaire

2024 Embryo Transfer &/or ICSI Report for Veterinarian

All foals MUST BE conceived and born in NM to be eligible for NM Bred status. If a Broodmare (Dam, Donor Mare (open or carrying) and/or Recipient Mares) bred to a registered NM Stallion, spends any part of the pregnancy outside the state of New Mexico:

- The application and the \$500 fee must be postmarked no later than the deadline of October 1st of the breeding year. If the application and \$500 fee are NOT received by the applicable deadline, there is a ten day grace period and then the fee increases to \$1,000 for the foal to be eligible for NM Bred status.
- Every donor mare and every recipient mare that is taken to board out of state must have their own form filled out and you must pay \$500.00 for each or the larger \$1,000 penalty if the October 1 deadline is missed.

EXCEPTION (Bylaw change January 25, 2024):

• 1. All assisted reproduction techniques including but not limited to the transfer of embryos or oocytes must be performed within the State of New Mexico unless the service is not readily available in the state. OOCYTES may be done in other states if the out-of-state ICSI requirements are followed. The mare would be required to be enrolled in the Export Broodmare Program by October 1st of the year she was taken out of New Mexico.

All mares must be registered in the Permanent New Mexico
Broodmare Registry by September 1 of the breeding year or penalties
will apply to all foals.

STALLION EVA REQUIREMENTS

EVA REQUIREMENTS FOR NEW STALLIONS

All stallions MUST have a negative EVA test and be vaccinated for EVA within 10 days of the COLLECTION date according to the rules of the New Mexico Livestock Board before you can register them in the NM Permanent Stallion Registry.

EVA REQUIREMENTS FOR STALLIONS IN OUR REGISTRY

All NM registered stallions must have an annual EVA booster vaccination.

Per NM Livestock Board regulations, they must be quarantined for 28 days after receiving the booster because it is a live virus and can be passed to other horses.

The deadline to turn in the EVA Booster Certificate to our office is February 1, 2025.
