

#### 2023 NEW MEXICO BREEDER OF THE YEAR

Fred A. Alexander

Ranch has been recognized as the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association's New Mexico breeder of the year. The Alexanders stand some of the state's top sires at their Anthony, N.M., farm, including 2023 New Mexico leading stallion Marking as well as the state's 2023 leading first-crop sire Sporting Chance.

"We've been here 25 years and we're proud to achieve this," Fred Alexander said. "It's been a lot of hard work but I owe most of it to my staff and my clients that have been with us over the years.

"We've been fortunate enough to have five of the state's leading stallions over the last 20 years."

Besides standing their three stallions, the Alexanders' operation focuses primarily on breeding and selling their yearlings through their own consignment each year at the Ruidoso Select New Mexico-Bred Yearling

A & A Ranch was the leading consignor the last two years at the New Mexico-Bred Yearling Sale and was responsible for the 2022 and 2023 sales toppers. In both years, the sale topper sold for six figures, a significant accomplishment in the Land of Enchantment.

Fred and Linda Alexander's A & A Marking, a grade 1-placed son of Bernardini, won New Mexico's leading sires race by a landslide. The stallion boasted progeny earnings of \$2,580,008 for 2023 with his closest competitor, the deceased and former A & A Ranch sire Attila's Storm, finishing second in the standings with \$1,740,673. The blue-blooded Marking, produced out of the multiple grade 1-winning mare Seventh Street, sired 46 winners from 73 foals to race. He sired two black-type winners, including New Mexico Classic Cup Lassie Championship Stakes victor Mark the Winner.

> After beginning his stud career for a fee of \$3,500 when first retiring to A & A Ranch, Marking commanded a fee of \$7,500 for the 2024 breeding season. Seven months into 2024, he currently leads the stallion standings with progeny earnings of \$1,108,776 and 17 winners through July 11.

> "Marking had the ability on the racetrack. He was second to champion Runhappy the year that one was champion sprinter," Alexander said. "And obviously he has the pedigree behind him. He has a very strong female family on his bottom side. ... I'm very big on the female side as that's where I believe a lot of it is coming from. And he's also got the A.P. Indy on top."

> The sire's best progeny to date is New Mexico-bred champion Slammed, who took her sire to the next level when rocketing to a 6 1/2-length score in the 2022 Thoroughbred Club of America Stakes (G2) at Keeneland. She retired with earnings of \$557,030.


> "(Marking has) been breeding to better and better mares and my biggest goal is for his offspring to run in open company and compete on that national level," Alexander said. "And hopefully one day I'll have a Slammed of my own. That's the ultimate goal." .





"Miss Hi Tide broke sharply from post 10 and sped to a wire-to-wire victory in the October 13, \$442,075 New Mexico State Fair Derby (RG3) for state-bred sophomore Quarter Horses at Albuquerque Downs.

Trained by Wes Giles for owner Uno Menos, Miss Hi Tide covered 400 yards in :19.280, and her winning margin was one length from Bigg Picture. Christian Cardenas rode the sorrel Woodbridge filly, who earned a 97 speed index while pocketing the \$221,038 from her second lifetime stakes victory. Miss Hi Tide was the fifth-fastest qualifier from five trials run on September 21. The filly was bred by Mac and Janis Murray's MJ Farms at Veguita, New Mexico, and she was an \$80,000 purchase at the 2022 Ruidoso Select Yearling Sale....

"KJ Bad Moon Rising, a homebred son of KJ Mucho Macho Man racing for John and Kathy Lee, won American Quarter Horse racing's richest race for state-breds, the October 13, \$1,160,420 New Mexico State Fair Futurity (RG2) at Albuquerque Downs.

Racing against a reported 5-mph head wind, KJ Bad Moon Rising covered 400 yards in :19.389, and his margin of victory was a head from JLB Eye The Tiger. Adrian Ramos rode the bay gelding for trainer Wes Giles.

KJ Bad Moon Rising was the second-fastest qualifier from 14 trials run September 20. The gelding's sire, KJ Mucho Macho Man, is a winning 7-year-old son of 2010 AQHA world champion Apollitical Jess..."

# DO YOU REMEMBER ... OLIVER & JUNE WEST

she lived in Hereford, Texas that year.



Oliver and June West horses and he didn't. So he broke a steer to ride. When he graduated to horses, later, he rode them the usual way but also standing on them and every other way.

The boy was – and still is -- a horseman.

June West's maiden name was Heck. She grew up at Cimarron, New Mexico. Her mother moved to a place far from any school when June was a high school senior, so

Oliver Lee West grew up at Hereford, Texas, the

youngest boy in the family. For awhile his brothers had

A bareback bronc riding wreck during that year left Oliver with a broken vertebrae in his back. His little sister brought her friend June around and introduced them. "I had a back brace and several days of whiskers and looked terrible," Oliver remembers, "so she didn't think too much of me."

Besides, he didn't want to go out with his sister's little friend. June just smiles and doesn't say much about that, but even though it took a couple of years they eventually got around to getting married." That was 57 years ago.

Oliver is closing in on age 80, June is 76, and they are still having fun with the horses.

They ended up in New Mexico, even though Oliver as told, "Don't move to New Mexico. You'll starve to

death." They didn't, obviously, and have been doing just fine at their place they call Westland near Moriarty since 1962.

They raised four sons: Randy, Roger, Rodney and Robbie. Seven years after Robbie they had their daughter, Kristi. All the kids are excellent hands, but Kristi even trained an Arabian – by herself – her parents proudly note. The boys all live nearby, but Kristi and her family are in Kansas.

The first taste of horse racing came when a fellow named Emmit Sherman had a mare in foal at the same time as Oliver. They made a bet on whose foal would win in a race. "The bet was for \$200 and I think we spent a thousand getting them ready to run," Oliver says with a smile.

They got a retired trainer to teach the horses to come out of the gate and run like regular race horses. Emmit's rider used a hotshot on his horse when he came out of the gate and "he went to bucking," Oliver says. "Emmit hated to lose a race that way so we put them back in the gates again. I outran him. Our youngest, Robbie, was about 4 or 5 years old, and he'd bet Emmit two quarters. He chased Emmit down and said he wanted his two quarters, so Emmit stopped in the middle of the track and paid him off."

Oliver said he'd never run an ugly horse. With Smashing N Dashing as a sire, if he decides to breed his own mares to him there won't be a problem. That stallion definitely is good looking.



a hurricane herself, even though she kinda messed up on her first official race. "She came out of the six hole and wiped out everybody between herself and the rail," Oliver says. "She ended up second, but they disqualified her and put her last. I said, 'Don't tell anybody she belongs to us."

After she got the hang of it, Manorcliffe did just fine, thank you very much. Oliver and June still have a letter they received from Bill Humphries, manager of Santa Fe Downs at the time, congratulating them for breeding and owning the best 2-year-old of the 1983 meet.

Manorcliffe qualified for the 1983 New Mexico Horse Breeders Quarter Horse Futurity. Oliver and Billy Powell decided to sleep in the stall the night before the race. "We put cots in front of the stall,


around barefoot very well. So she gathered up an old pair and went to the track. By the time that all happened, June didn't have time to go to the bank. "I had these orders from friends and relatives. especially in Hereford, to buy tickets," she says, "so I found Anna Fay Davis and said, 'You don't

know me, but I really need to cash a check."

Anna Fay cashed

Anna Fay cashed her check. Manorcliffe won the futurity and paid \$52 to win. Oliver, meanwhile, spent the day walking around, head down, looking for his boots on every pair of feet he met. Later, Anna Fay enjoyed telling Oliver she believed he could afford to buy some more new boots after that win.

Last spring the Wests' mare, Savannahs Real Wind had twins by Buckle Up Jet (1990 Southwest Region High Point 3-year old colt). Everybody was excited. and the colts were doing well. One day Oliver was in the corral with them in the morning, then when he went back in mid-afternoon one baby was dead. "I think maybe another

mare kicked him," he says.

The surviving colt, Savannahs Buckle Up, looks and acts great. Still, everyone is disappointed over losing the other one.

"The last filly Manorcliffe had is Midnite Manor," says
Oliver. "I bred her to Noble Silence (Thoroughbred) and
we got Miracle Manor. That one is nominated to next
year's All American Futurity." Nobody enjoys watching their
horses run more and when the trials run Oliver and June
will be there.

Oliver has had some heart problems, surgeries, etc.

They had a horse entered a couple of years ago, and

Oliver was in the hospital getting some stents. "I talked the

doctor into letting me out early so I could go watch

our horse run," he says. "He won that day."

"We put cots in front of the stall, and we put our boots — mine were brand new — in front of the curtain," Oliver says. "I woke up about four in the morning and my new boots were gone."

Oliver and June have one Thoroughbred at the track -Smarty Bar. He's a good one, but Oliver can't decide whether to acquire more Thoroughbreds. "It is hard to get in Quarter Horse Races." he says, "but I really never liked to ride a long-legged Thoroughbred horse."

Also, June does the books, and she reports that registering mares in both associations is a real pain.


While they decide, they have an outstanding stallion standing at Westland – Smashing N Dashing. "He was here last breeding season, and he'll be here this time, also," Oliver said.


Smashing N Dashing, si 94, by First Down Dash and out of Dela Creme Smash by Easily Smashed, won the Remington Park Futurity, was a finalist in the G2 Remington Park Derby, set the track record for 400 yards at Remington Park. He has produced seven winners out of 10 starters.



All foals MUST BE conceived and born in NM to be eligible for NM Bred status. If a Broodmare (Dam, Donor Mare (open or carrying) and/or Recipient Mares) bred to a registered NM Stallion, spends any part of the pregnancy outside the state of New Mexico:

- The application and the \$500 fee must be postmarked no later than the deadline of October 1st of the breeding year. If the application and \$500 fee are NOT received by the applicable deadline, there is a ten day grace period and then the fee increases to \$1,000 for the foal to be eligible for NM Bred status.
- Every donor mare and every recipient mare that is taken to board out of state must have their own form filled out and you must pay \$500.00 for each or the larger \$1,000 penalty if the October 1 deadline is missed.

#### **EXCEPTION** (Bylaw change January 25, 2024):

1. All assisted reproduction techniques including but not limited to the transfer of embryos or oocytes must be performed within the State of New Mexico unless the service is not readily available in the state. OOCYTES may be done in other states if the out-of-state ICSI requirements are followed. The mare would be required to be enrolled in the Export Broodmare Program by October 1st of the year she was taken out of New Mexico.

All mares must be registered in the Permanent New Mexico
Broodmare Registry by September 1 of the breeding year or penalties
will apply to all foals.

# STALLION EVA REQUIREMENTS

# **EVA REQUIREMENTS FOR STALLIONS IN OUR REGISTRY**

All NM registered stallions must have an annual EVA booster vaccination.

Per NM Livestock Board regulations, they must be quarantined for 28 days after receiving the booster because it is a live virus and can be passed to other horses.

The deadline to turn in the EVA Booster Certificate to our office is February 1, 2025.

#### HORSE RESCUE IN NEW MEXICO



The State of New Mexico, in cooperation with members of the State Legislature and Governor's Office, established laws governing horse rescues in the State of New Mexico.

The New Mexico Livestock Board is the regulatory authority governing abuse and neglect of Livestock.

In conjunction with the livestock industry, horse industry veterinarians and humane associations, a procedure for the care of abandoned and neglected horses has been established and implemented in New Mexico.

The New Mexico Livestock Board licenses horse rescue, sanctuary and retirement facilities in the state. This includes facilities which provide care for captured wild horses that cannot

be returned to their range. Listed below are the facilities currently licensed and approved. These licensed facilities have subscribed to the standards of care for horses as detailed in "Care Guidelines for Equine Rescue and Retirement Facilities", published by the American Association of Equine Practitioners.
