

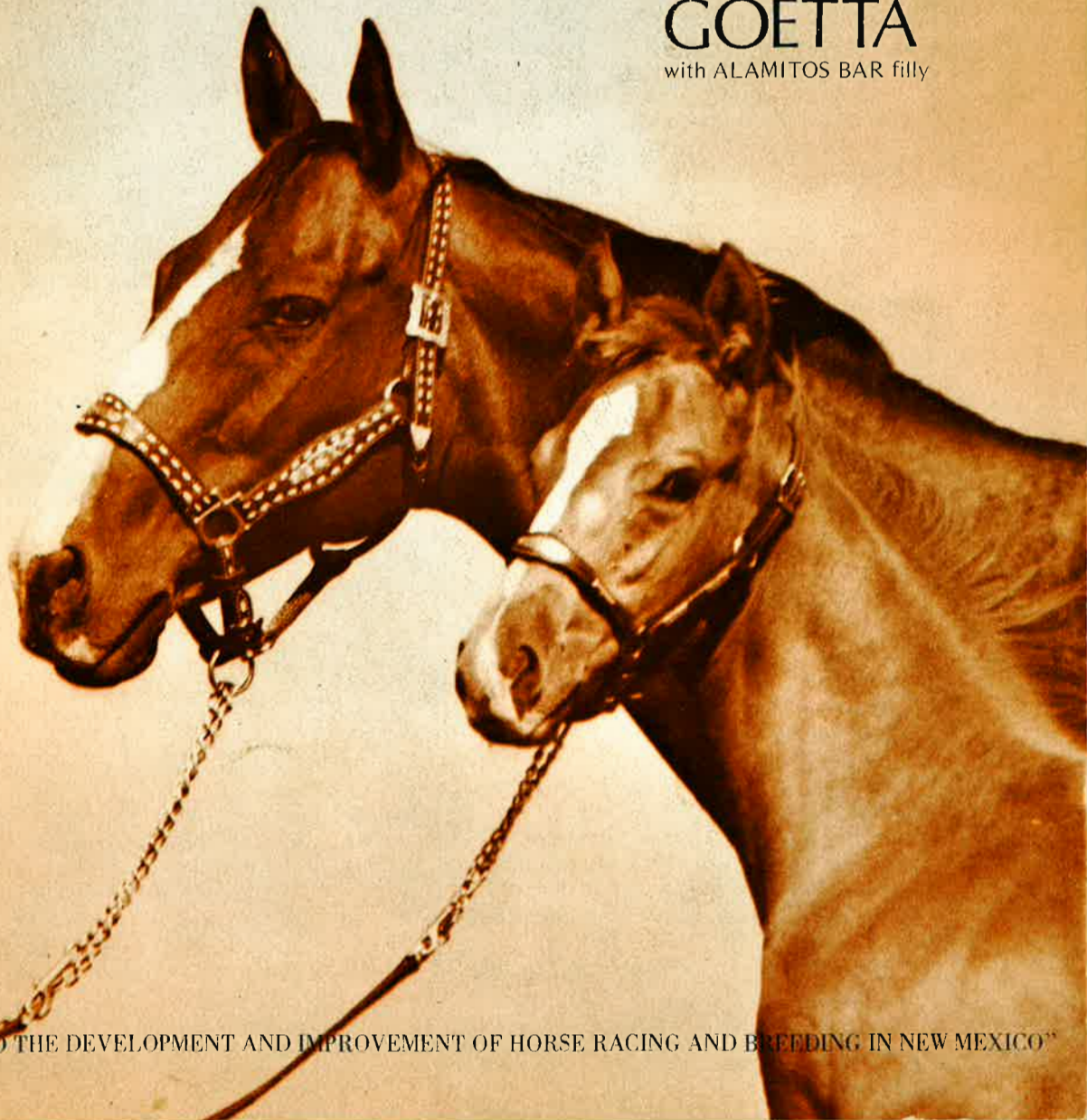

EDITORIAL

Veteran racing authority, Frank Vessels, Jr., of Los Alamitos Race Course, addressed the NASRC convention last April in San Francisco and had this to say in the course of his fine talk: "Through the country hundreds of colleges and universities are producing a never-ending supply of young men for every industry imaginable . . . yet here is a multi-billion dollar horse racing industry that must rely on the centuries-old apprentice system and an occasional short course with which to educate its personnel."

NASRC prexy, Urgel G. Bell of Lacrosse, Washington, recently echoed Vessels' opinion during the AQHA Racing Conference in Columbus, Ohio.

We say, "Hear! Hear!" to these two gentlemen, with hopes that their thinking bears fruit. We might go one step farther in suggesting that horse racing cultivate for management and officialdom a fertile ground which it already possesses. Many jockeys are honorable and astute young men who are too soon unable to make their needed riding weights. They know racing in all but a few areas. They know horses, trainers, owners, jockeys, and they are aware of the good as well as the bad in racing. They have the experience and background to convert into first class racing officials and management personnel. Many have gone through years of on-the-job training so necessary for the good stewardship of the horse racing sport.

Some debate, "Jockeys are dishonest." We challenge this as utterly ridiculous, and one must no more buy this premise than one can buy the absurd premise that all horse races are fixed.

We suggest that racing consider a "finishing school", so to speak, for converting some of these young men into management status. The embryo is there.

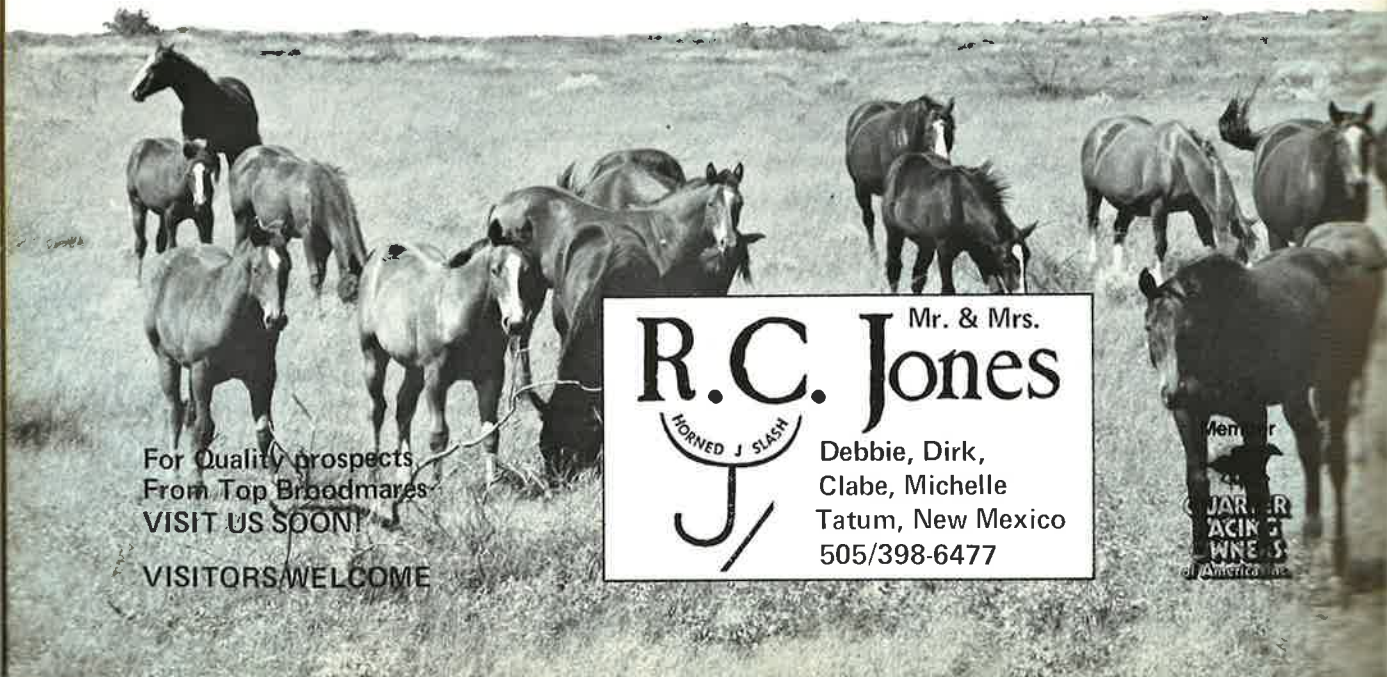

Objectives

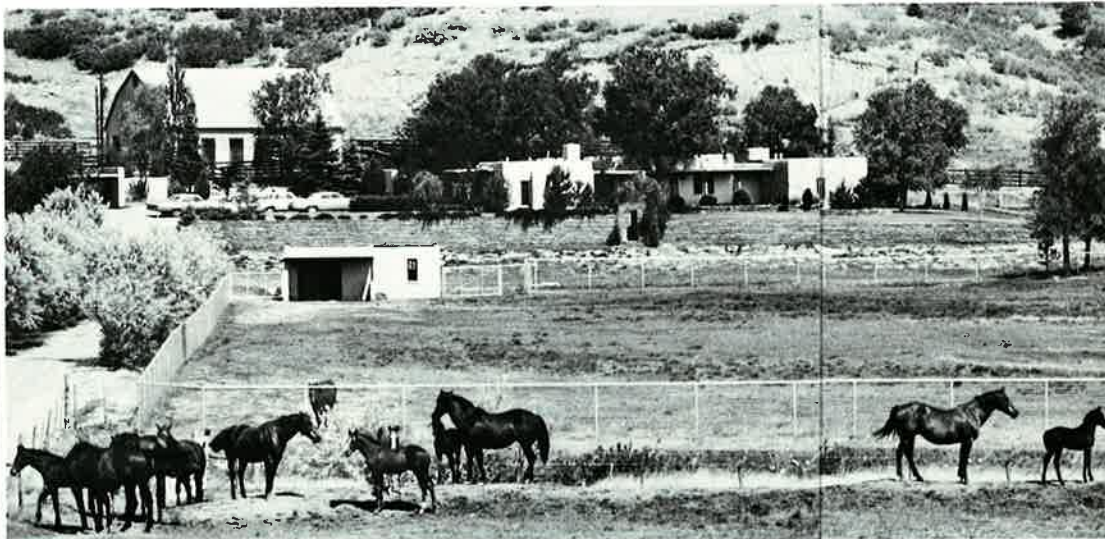

- (g) TO COMPILE AND DISSEMINATE INFORMATION OF VALUE TO OWNERS AND BREEDERS OF NEW MEXICO HORSES, AND TO PUBLICIZE NEW MEXICO BRED FOALS AND NEW MEXICO BRED/FOALED STAKES RACES IN EVERY WAY POSSIBLE;
- (h) TO FOSTER AND PRESERVE VIA A PERMANENT OFFICE AND LIBRARY, THE TRADITION, HISTORY AND RECORDS PERTAINING TO THE BREEDING, RAISING AND RACING OF HORSES IN THE STATE;
- (i) TO ASSIST, PROMOTE AND ENCOURAGE THE INTERESTS OF YOUTH IN THE OWNING, BREEDING AND RAISING OF THOROUGHBRED AND QUARTER HORSE RACING STOCK IN THE STATE;
- (j) TO ENCOURAGE COOPERATIVE EFFORT AMONG ALL MEMBERS OF THE HORSE RACING COLONY IN NEW MEXICO TO ACHIEVE THE FOREGOING OBJECTIVES AND PURPOSES.

The Passing Parade

SUNLAND PARK OPENS with a horse population of about 1100. The season will cover 95 racing days and will offer horsemen total purses of over \$1,750,000. The season kicks off Oct. 7th.

ART JOHNSON NAMED GENERAL MANAGER of Santa Fe Downs. The former president of Fortuna Corporation (who owned controlling interest in Sunland Park and Ruidoso Downs) will assume full time duties at Santa Fe November 1st, according to J. W. Eaves, president of Santa Fe Downs.

MINIMUM PURSE AT SUNLAND will be \$1200. Two years ago the top Quarter Horse purse was only \$800. The \$1200 minimum applies to both Thoroughbred and Quarter Horses.

NATIVE TANGO LOOKING FOR more victories. The rags-to-riches colt was bought for \$1,600 as a yearling and has earned over \$83,000. He has won 7 of his 10 starts with 2 seconds and 1 third. At Sunland he will be eyeing the Eyes of Texas Thoroughbred Futurity. He won the Land of Enchantment Futurity at La Mesa Park at 7-1.

DEMOCRAT GEORGE MCGOVERN, candidate for president, has issued a statement to eliminate "tax shelter" farm losses, according to the American Horse Council. Senator McGovern's proposal is similar to the bill (S. 2487) proposed by Senator Lee Metcalf of Montana. The American Horse Council has a Tax Reference Service that will keep horsemen informed. LA MESA PARK CLOSED its 27th Annual Racing Season and showed a mutuel handle of \$7,390,203 and total purses of \$1,199,792. Total attendance for the 55 day meet was 110,470. Daily average wagering was \$134,367. The total handle showed a 3.75% increase over last season, and the second largest in the track's history. Figures show that 865 registered owners stabled horses, with 255 trainers on the grounds. Thoroughbreds numbered 894 and Quarter Horses 572.

LA MESA PARK NAMES season's best: Colorado Maid, Aged Thoroughbred; Lusty Gallant, 3-year-old Thoroughbred; Jolly Jet Deck, Aged Quarter Horse; Le Cinder, 3-year-old Quarter Horse; Possumjet, 2-year-old Quarter Horse, and Jolly Jet Deck, the 1972 All Distance Series Champion. Top money winning Thoroughbred was Native Tango with \$63,075, owned by Jo Hutton and Nancy Shelton of Lubbock & Clarendon, Texas. Byou Bird, owned by Walter Merrick of Sayre, Oklahoma, was the leading Quarter Horse with \$75,212.

NEW IDENTIFICATION METHOD is being tested by the Boeing Company. It consists of a capsule which is implanted under the animal's skin. The capsule is an electronic device which requires no batteries or internal power. The capsule returns a signal to another machine which corresponds to the animal's identification number.

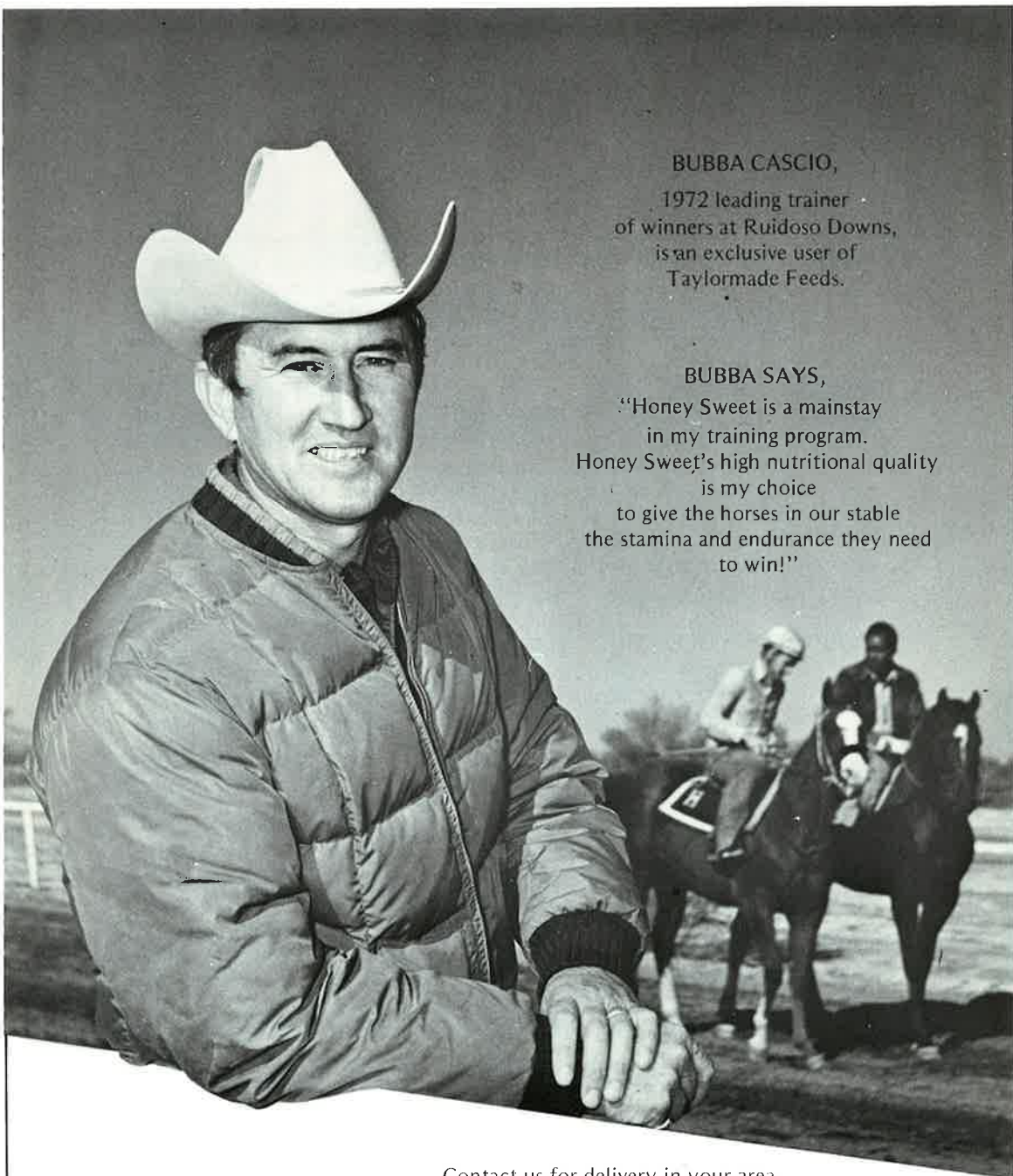
NEWEST CONFIRMED VEE CASES some 275 miles south of Nogales, so reports the USDA. A team of specialists has been sent to Nogales, Arizona to conduct special surveillance activities. The USDA urges southwestern horsemen to vaccinate all horses not previously vaccinated.

SANDIA PUEBLO (NEW MEXICO) FILED A SUIT in U. S. District Court recently in an attempt to pave the way for building a pari-mutuel race track on Pueblo land with exemptions from state pari-mutuel laws and taxes as well as state liquor laws. A similar action is pending in Oklahoma where a \$3 million dollar exposition site is proposed. The Oklahoma action states, "Just as federal military reservations are not subject to state laws, neither should Indian lands be subject to a state law prohibiting pari-mutuel betting."

RUIDOSO DOWNS FINISHES SEASON WITH UPSWING. The most successful season in the track's history went into the record books. Total handle for the 63 day meeting was \$16,442,700, easily surpassing the previous high of \$13,759,422 set in last year's 59 day meeting. The 1972 daily wagering average showed a rise of 12.6% over last year. Total attendance was 315,232 for a daily average of 5,003, or a 3.9% rise over last year's attendance. Total purse disbursement for the season was \$3,237,154, another all-time Ruidoso record.

COME SIX AND MR. TATTOO - 1972 CHAMPIONS at Ruidoso. Come Six was chosen the Champion Quarter Horse and Mr. Tattoo the Champion Thoroughbred. Possumjet was the choice in the Quarter Horse juvenile category. Mr. Jet Moore got the nod as the top 3-year-old Quarter Horse. Alamitos Angel was voted the Best Quarter Horse Mare; Norgor the top 870 horse; Big Profit the best 550 horse of the meet. Mr. Tattoo was also the season's leading 3-year-old Thoroughbred; Grand Charger the best in the Thoroughbred juvenile class. Tarjeta, a three year old, got the vote as the best Thoroughbred mare or filly; Paso Peace, the best Thoroughbred sprinter, and Holy Stone the top router of the meet.

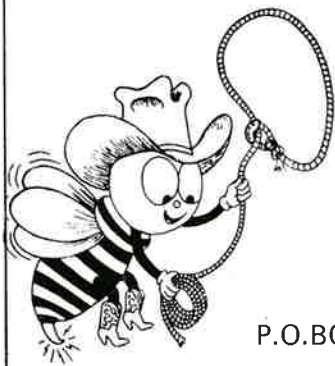

Nugent, secretary, Mervin Martin, treasurer. All these officers were also appointed directors. Also appointed as new directors were John C. Sams and Dale Robertson. Five members of the previous board remained as directors. They are Mike J. Coen, John F. Simms, Jr., E. G. Wright, W. L. (Sunny) Edwards, and M. F. Drinkhouse.

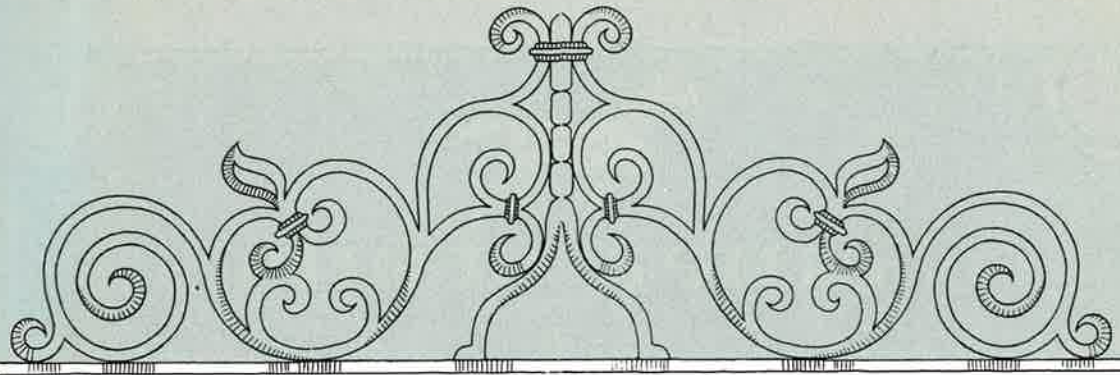

Interview with NMHBA President WINFORD CARLILE

"New Mexico can become the leader. We've got the climate over Kentucky. Sure, they've been at it longer, about 150 years, but our horses trained here are 45 to 60 days ahead of horses trained back there in any one season. We have the advantage if we can develop." Winford Carlile leaned back in his chair. He was dressed casual and sat behind a black leather-topped desk in the president's office of the deserted bank lobby. He had just returned from a three hour Saturday morning session watching colts in training at his breeding and training farm south of Hobbs.

"We've got the best potential there is with our weather and soil conditions. Last year we missed only one or two days of training due to bad weather and that is a real advantage. Also, the climate is ideal for bringing mares in heat sooner, giving us early foals." Carlile reiterated his points in a soft but strong voice lightly laced with a western drawl. As President of the Lovington Liberty National Bank, President of the New Mexico Horse Breeders' Association, co-owner of C&H Farms, and member of the Board of Directors at Santa Fe Downs, Carlile is one of New Mexico's leading horsemen.

New Mexico, Carlile contends, is now being discovered by industry of all types. "We have been somewhat of a hidden spectre until now; nobody ever realized what we had here until recently." With this discovery, growth is coming in many areas. The horse breeding-training-racing industry is one of the forerunners. Interest in New Mexico for the horse industry is beginning to climb and Carlile, like most other concerned horsemen in the state, is convinced that the state has a chance to become one of the leaders in the industry.

Carlile's interests lies in Thoroughbreds. Six stallions stand at his ranch today. "It takes considerable money to build one of these plants," he says, "and past purses in New Mexico have not

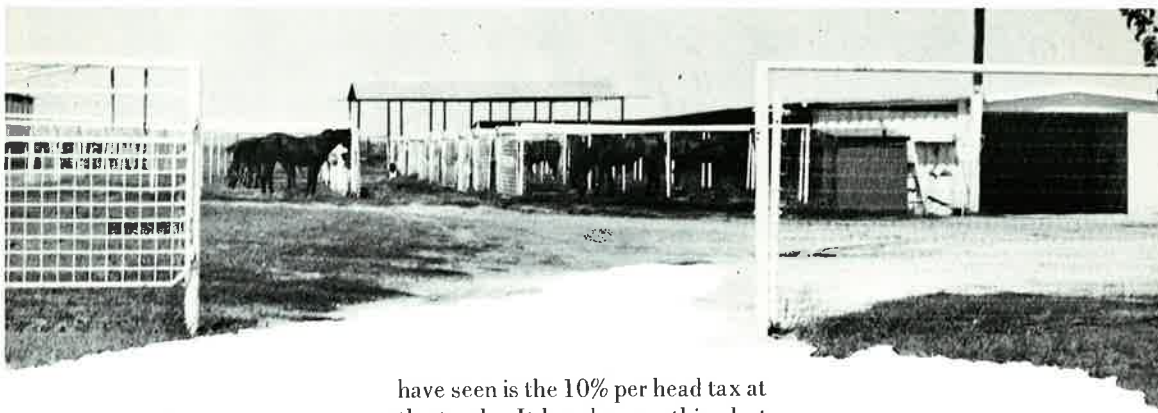
been conducive to large capital outlays." Purses in state Thoroughbred races are gradually improving, but New Mexico still lags behind the rest of the nation. However, there is a trend toward state breeding and training operations with a steady increase in the amount of purses.

"We're working with all segments of the racing industry in the state, attempting to encourage better local bred stock", Carlile says. "This is one of the ways we can increase our local purses. The better quality of the racing stock, the bigger the purses."

Stock quality represents only one of the problems Carlile sees for the horse breeder and trainer in New Mexico. Of course, there are assets for each problem and Carlile is well versed in each area. Each separate area of the horse breeding and training industry represents a unique and complex part of the whole industry. One of the first problems in the minds of New Mexico horsemen is in the area of the state government's role in the growing horse breeding-training-racing industry.

"Of course" . . . Carlile leans back in his chair and focuses his eyes on the ceiling, "the state itself is going to have to give us a hand. Some people in Santa Fe feel the racing industry is not paying its fair share of the taxes. If they will give us a chance to build a solid industry, they will realize more money in the long run even though





we will be paying smaller taxes at the onset."

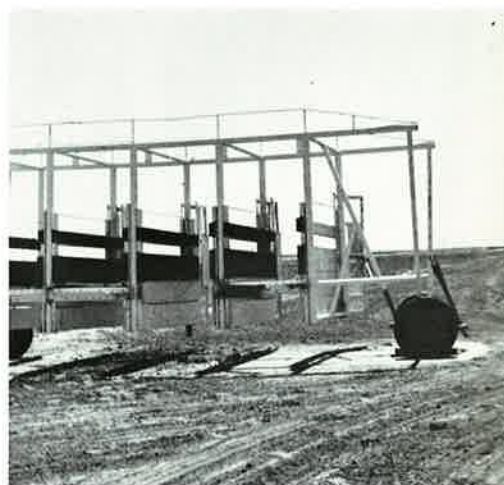
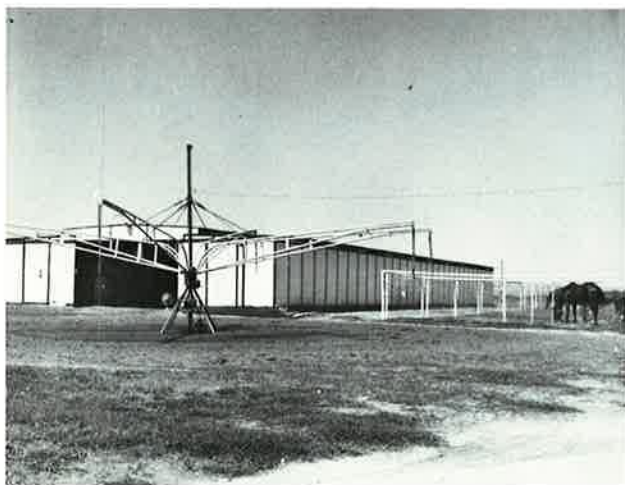
"I think Santa Fe will become more aware of our needs and potential in the future. I feel most of the men up there are farsighted enough to see that by helping the industry through its embryo period it will pay off in the long run. Most of our legislators are men whose basic concern is the development of New Mexico. But there are some that will say the industry has been here for 30 to 40 years and ask, how much time will it take to develop? In my opinion, the industry - at least the Thoroughbred side of it - is only four or five years old. Before that time horse breeding and training was basically a one-man operation. Now that the bigger breeding and training farms are beginning to operate here, the state can look to see some full scale operations."

Turning the discussion to specific points of legislation Carlile says, "One of the biggest farces we

have seen is the 10% per head tax at the tracks. It has done nothing but make people mad. It is not the gate receipts nor that 10% per head tax that is going to produce real revenue. It is the pari-mutuel gamble, the money the horse owner and racing fan spend coming to the track, and what they spend while in the state that will produce the revenue. "Also," he continues, "I've recently heard considerable criticism of the 4% owner tax ruling. Several out-of-state owners have stated because of this tax they will not come into New Mexico until we have a race with a big purse they can run at. Then they will head back across the state line. This condition in itself brings up another problem. One of the biggest problems affecting the quality of New Mexico's Thoroughbred stock is that the quality and money leave the state after the big races. This is preventing New Mexican horsemen from increasing the quality of their stock."

Carlile feels there is a definite overall shortage of quality and fit Thoroughbred stock in New Mexico. "Our stallions," he says, "are as of fine a quality anywhere but the quality of our broodmares is not where it should be. When you talk about a proven producer you are talking anywhere from \$100,000 to \$200,000 and on up, and it just has not been economically feasible in the past for most New Mexico breeders to make this type of investment on any scale."

This condition has caused western - and particularly New Mexican breeders - to take a hard look during the yearling sales. The technique is to spot a potential racing prospect that will also be a good broodmare. This has and is beginning to show on the quality of New Mexico stock, and today when a westerner goes to one of the eastern sales he is recognized "as being there to buy."

Carlile predicts the gradual increase of quality in New Mexico-bred and foal will begin to show better during the coming five years. During this time he expects "New Mexico Bred and Foal Futurities" to help out financially and to encourage more improvements of quality. "We live here and pay the taxes," he contends, "and in a way these races force in state purses. It is only a matter of time before no one will have to apologize for the quality of New Mexico bred and foal Thoroughbreds."

Carlile believes that as the quality of New Mexico stock improves so will Thoroughbred purses at state tracks. The increase, he contends, will add fuel to the fires that are already beginning to burn. But there are some handicaps. "I think the largest handle we had this year was at Ruidoso during the Labor Day weekend. We had something in the area of \$600,000. If some of the major tracks in other states got down to a handle that small they would have to shut down. Because of New Mexico's sparse population we are limited to three or four days of racing a week. So, we have to get all the tax breaks we can so the track owners can upgrade their plants and purses can be made more attractive. With low purses there is no need for high quality stock. Why should a man have a horse worth more than \$1,500 or \$2,500 if his purse potential runs from \$600 to \$1,000? It is the difference between seeing \$1,500 horses and \$500,000 horses. The pari-mutuel handle is increasing slowly and the purses are also beginning to increase, but New Mexico still has a long way to go.

Turning to the tax picture for

the breeding and racing industry, Carlile gives some basis of understanding why professional people are turning to horse breeding and racing as a second business. Professional people in larger income brackets usually already have a tax problem. As a racing and breeding owner, the possibility for additional capital income and some attractive tax benefits exist. Basically, a horse is a depreciable item. The fact that it produces income on the track only adds capital gain. The benefit comes in the depreciation-appreciation scale.

Actually, as the horse gets older its value is depreciated while its worth can increase through its get. On the other hand, there is something satisfying about having a horse, watching it develop and finally run on the track. It is a sport and business - a potential second business or sideline that provides potential good profits and tax shelters at the same time. Whatever the goal, the numbers of owners are increasing.

A native Texan, Carlile moved to New Mexico 20 years ago. Prior to the move he was a bank examiner. He has been president of the Lovington Liberty National Bank for the past five years. He first became involved in the horse breeding and racing industry about 14 years ago. At that time he bought 80 acres of land south of Hobbs. Two years ago Bill Henry, a close personal friend, joined him in an effort to establish a quality Thoroughbred breeding and training farm. Today Henry is the farm manager. His wife, Jorene, assists in the clerical and record keeping work. Henry's 22 year-old son, Floyd, and Frank Leal, Jr., an ex-jockey, round out the staff.

Currently six Thoroughbred stallions are standing at C&H Farms. They include: Brand Time T by Yerno out of Sybil T; Binary by Khaled out of Grey Miss; Cafe Amargo by Beau Max out of La Marga; Jeep Driver by Tommy Lee out of Speed Shot; Mijube's Sailor by Sailor out of Bold Sequence, and Purple Pigeon by T. V. Lark.

"Everyone," Carlile says, "is familiar with Binary, Jeep Driver and Brand Time T. They are the older and proven studs while the other three are not fully proven yet."

Since Henry and Carlile began their effort, they have built a 20 porta-stall barn; a stud barn with six porta-stalls; a one-half mile training track; 40 enclosed stalls; 80 individual pens and paddocks. The ranch is located on 80 acres. The paddocks are in alfalfa and fescue.

Sometime in the future the men hope to construct a foaling barn with medical facilities. "We still have a few items to do," says Carlile.

Regarding plans and their overall goal, Carlile wants "to make it into the best breeding and training farm in the southwest. This is in line with our physical plant, and we do have what we consider to be some of the highest caliber stallions standing anywhere in this part of the country."

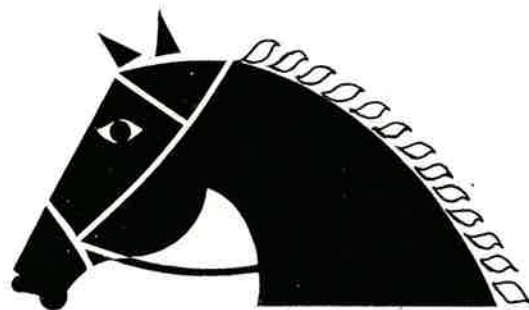

Ably guided by jockey Richard Bickel, the fleet son of Dancing Dervish was fourth coming into the first turn but began his move at that point to take over third close behind Kid Loco and Joy Lutza. Shortly after making the second turn into the stretch, he took command and turned in a strong finish to out-distance Kid Loco by a neck.

The Governor of New Mexico's Administrative Aide Eldon Marrs from Santa Fe was on hand to make the winner's presentation of a handsome punch bowl and tray of New Mexico's Nambé ware.

Native Tango has turned out to be a real "Cinderella" colt for his two owners who purchased him in last summer's Haymaker Sale at La Mesa Park for \$1,600.00. His earnings now top the \$83,000.00 mark. He is conditioned by trainer Johnnie L. Jamison.

Kid Loco, representing Bill Luke, Phoenix, Arizona, with Jeff Anderson aboard, finished second in the Fifth Running of the big event to earn \$20,187.57. The freshman son of Crazy Kid is trained by Richard Hazelton.

Third for \$11,875.04 was Joy Lutza, owned by Joe B. Bowers Stables, Inc., Boulder, Colorado. Trained by Don Von Hemel, the daughter of Johns Joy was ridden by D. W. Whited.

Hodges and Ben Osher, Phoenix, Arizona; seventh for \$3,562.52, Binaphantom, Jack Van Berg, Columbus, Nebraska; eighth for \$2,375.01, Tables' Matriarch, Elizabeth J. Wallace, Albuquerque, New Mexico, and ninth and tenth, respectively, for \$1,187.50, Swaps Alibhai, Charlene and Bill Wallace, Amarillo, Texas, and Desired Image, Joe L. Gary, Purcell, Oklahoma.

3,226 racing fans were in attendance to witness the 'Enchantment' Futurity, which offered a new all-time record total purse of \$165,000.00. The mutual zoomed to the current season's highest - \$227,689.00.

It was 15 years ago that his friend, Tex Barron, talked John Augustine into breeding the Augustine's \$100 family mare, Nora's Gold by Del Monte, to Bright Bar, a son of Three Bars (TB) owned by C. L. Maddon. "Try to get yourself a runner," said Tex. "That's where the money is going to be in the horse business."

Barron was so right and Augustine did come with a runner. As a matter of fact, several from that cross, as the years have gone by. Bright Sherry, the mare produced by Nora's Gold and Bright Bar has over and over again produced success on New Mexico's best tracks. The latest, of course, was Sherry's Rebel by Bright Rebel, winner of the classic \$60,000 New Mexico Futurity at the State Fair in Albuquerque.

"We're a small horse business and we have no intention of letting it get big," said Augustine recently while proudly displaying his win pictures in his comfortable office in Las Cruces.

John Augustine and his wife, Elise, have devoted a lifetime to horses. They live on a small

farm 10 miles north of Las Cruces where they keep three broodmares and their foals. The Augustines try to keep at least one foal at the track year around.

Born in Lordsburg, Augustine is the son of a Canadian mining engineer and a daughter of Texas. A graduate of the New Mexico Military Institute, he has been active in horse racing and agricultural circles most of his life. For many years he has been manager of the New Mexico Farm and Livestock Bureau and its service affiliates with offices in Las Cruces, and he has served two terms on the State Racing Commission, once as Chairman in 1963.

Augustine has also served as a member of the Board of Directors of the Ruidoso Racing Association. The Augustines have one daughter and a son, John, Jr., the latter a veterinarian in California.

John Augustine has been one of New Mexico horse racing's most devoted advocates for many years, and his contribution is immeasurable and continuing.



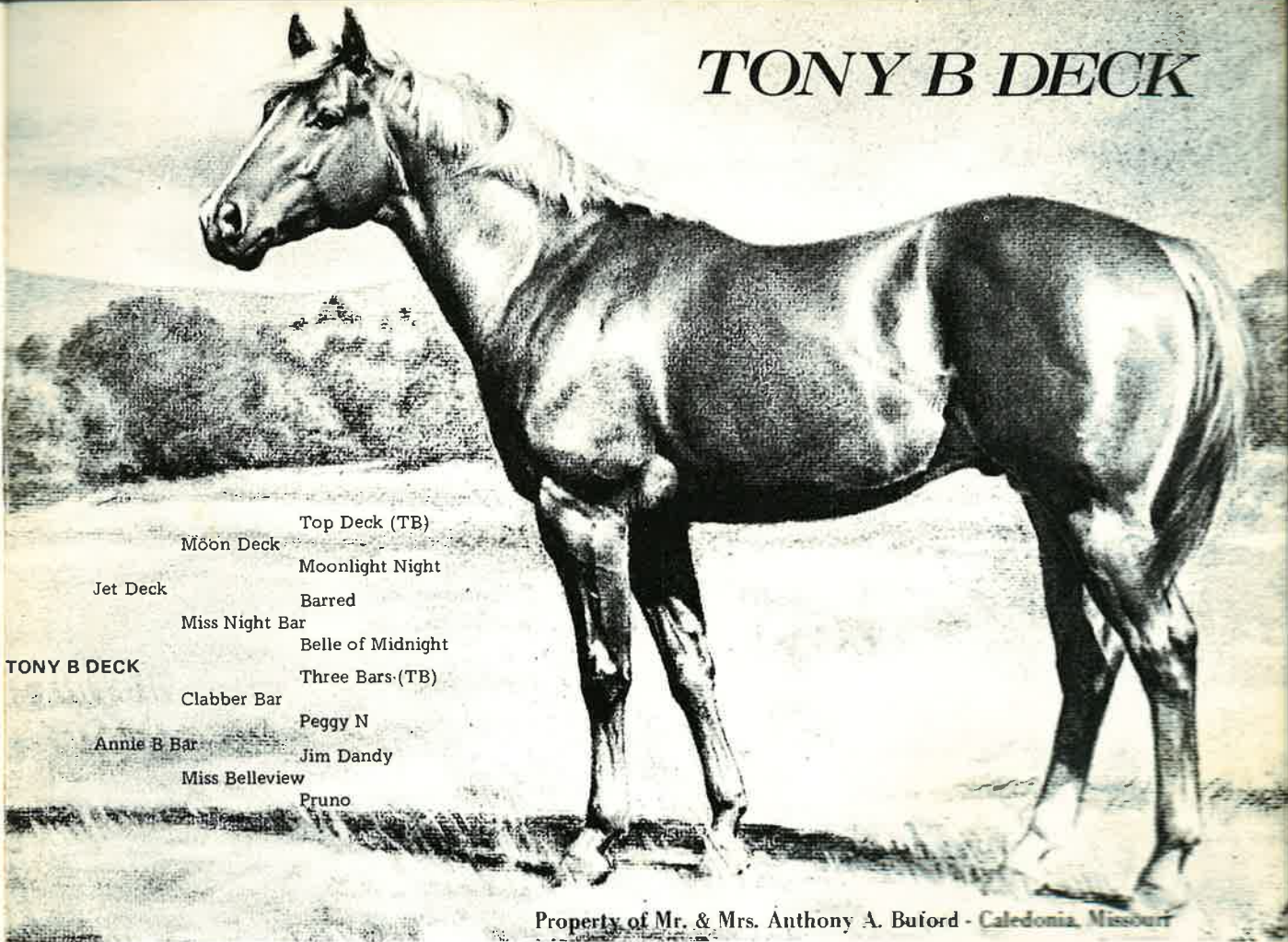
